5	CHAIRPERSON RODRIGUEZ: Good morning.
6	Daneek Miller [background comments] Good morning
7	and welcome to today's hearing of the New York City
8	Council Transportation Committee.
9	Before we begin I would like to thank
10	Mayor de Blasio and The Speaker, Melissa Mark-
11	Viverito for their great leadership throughout this
12	process; this process was filled with tense moments
13	and today I call for all to always remember that it
14	should be incumbent upon all who come with business
15	before the City to respect this body and all its
16	members and the Mayor too. We saw moments of
17	misinformation and distortion of the truth from Uber
18	[sic] and that will never be tolerated in our city.
19	Today we will vote on a piece of
20	legislation that has been the subject of widespread
21	and often passionate discussion. After much
22	deliberation we have decided to move forward with
23	Int. 847, a Local Law which I introduced to require
24	the Taxi and Limousine Commission to conduct a study

to examine the rapid-changing for-hire vehicle

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industry. This study will allow us to achieve our goal to develop the right policy prescriptions to alleviate the real problem of congestion on our city. As members of the City Council, it is our responsibility to ensure that our city takes the best path forward and I am confident that today we'll do just that.

Corporations should be a part of the solution to our city problems, not their source.

Uber has agreed to begin conversations around new streams to revenue for the MTA and increase protections for drivers, consumers and disabled community alike. Further, the also agreed to set their own limit on growth, achieving our goal of creating a solid baseline for the valid [sic] study. Once the study is concluded we will have enough information to work collectively using input from all industry stakeholders to put forward a new addition of policy.

The committee looks forward to continue discussion on pending legislation, such as Int. 556 introduced by Council Member Greenfield, limiting surge pricing; legislation which I'm proud to sponsor, Int. 740, expanding street record [sic]

requirements that will bring transparency regarding fair collected, pickup and drop-off locations and the use of accessible vehicle, and Int. 553, requiring base agreements.

Before we vote I would like to thank my colleague, Stephen Levin and his staff, Rami Metal and Casey Adams for all their hard work on this issue; my committee staff, Counsel Kelly Taylor, Policy Analyst Jonathan Masserano and Russell Murphy, as well as my own Chief of Staff Carmen de la Rosa and my Communications and Legislative Director Lucas Acosta.

I want to also acknowledge my colleagues who are here, Council Members Vacca, Miller, Chin, Constantinides, Miller, Reynoso, Richards, Van Bramer, Greenfield, Rose and Levin. And for the record, we have the numbers to pass both bills; we have decided to move only on one because Uber, probably for their own PR, decided to compromise and make their own changes. With that I now call for the vote on Int. No. 847 and ask the clerk to call the roll; the Chair recommends a yes vote.
