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CHAIR GREENFIELD: Good morning my name is David Greenfield, I'm the Council Member for the 44th Council District in Brooklyn and privileged to serve as the Chair of the Land Use Committee. I want to welcome my esteemed colleagues who are members of the Committee who are joining us today. I want to recognize that Council Member Andy Cohen for coming earliest today, thank you very much. Also want to recognize Council Member Gentile, Palma, Garodnick, Mealy, Mendez, Koo, Landers, Levin, Barron, Reynoso and Treyger. I want to thank all of you for prompt attendance. You will see on the table before you several items (inaudible 1:04) committee first. You will see agenda prepared by the Committee staff containing those matters to which we've had a hearing and have been reviewed and fully vetted by the Sub-Committee's, those are the matters in which we will be acting on today. I'd also like to take the opportunity to thank our Sub-Committee Chairs. Chair (inaudible 1:18), Chair Koo and a special thanks to Planning Sub-Committee substitute even though he's making a lot a noise during my hearing, I would thank him none the less, Chair Andy Cohen and we wish his speedy recovery to Chair Inez Dickens.

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Also before you we have the joint reports of the Land Use Committee and applicable SubCommittees for each item you're voting on today with the proposed resolution for each item with the
Committee is voting on today is to approve each of the resolutions before you for presentation and vote by the full Council. The resolutions reflect the recommendations of the applicable Sub-Committee. We have four items of which we are voting to approve today.

The first is LU#288. The New York Wheel, the application is a modification to special permit approved in 2013 for the construction of the New York Wheel and approximately 624 foot tall observation wheel in Staten Island. The modification to the site plan includes changes to the configuration of the parking sign, railroad decking, the open space plan and reduction in size of the terminal building. This application is in Council Member Rose's district.

Second item is LU#289 Hamilton Plaza. Hamilton Plaza associates is applying for modification to a strictly declaration of facilitate change for the use a physical cultural establishment on the $3^{\rm rd}$ floor and construction of the (inaudible

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2:23) floor. This application is in Council Member
Lander's district. We will be voting to approve this
item with modifications.

approval for their two year tax exemption under article 11 of the private housing finance law. Coterms with the regulatory agreement to facilitate the continue the affordability of the Home Street Homes housing development, approximately 102 units of housing. This application is in Council Arroyo's district.

Finally LU#294 the LPC Warehouse, HPD is seeking approval for UDAPT designation, project approval and disposition of City owned land at 337 Berry Street 99-101 South 5th Street to facilitate the development of 11th story mixed use building under the extremely low and low income affordability program. With 55 units of affordable housing and ground floor commercial and community facility space and this application is in Council Member Reynoso's district.

Sub-Committees have all recommended approval of these items as have the local Council Members.

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Any Council Members have any statements they'd like to make or questions on the applications? Council Member Reynoso.

COUNCIL MEMBER REYNOSO: Thank you Chair and also I want to thank Chair Cohen for a very good hearing and I just want to say in this application HPD had a very loose process, had very lacked a lot of communication as to how we should be moving forward when it comes to transparency in democratic and fair process that many more then one bitter can apply or make an attempt to replace an older bitter, I don't want to get into the details about what happens but it seems like especially in communities like mine, Latino communities so I want to be very clear that we they play by different rules. If this were to happen in another community I just don't see it happening the exact same way and you know I have two use my political chips to say the least is to put as much press on HPD to start doing things the right way. All I'm asking for is the same process every single time for every single application. And it doesn't happen in Williamsburg. But that doesn't mean that the community has to suffer without affordable housing. The not for profit doesn't need

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district and the City as a whole and we were able to as we've always been to maintain our positive working relationship with mutual respect and always enlight of how it will benefit the community as well as tourism in New York City. We overcame the challenges, we worked together and I really want to say that I truly believe that this is the best project that we were able to come up with and I fully support this... this application with modifications and I really look forward to all of you visiting the Wheel, we have made arrangements that every student in New York City would have the opportunity to ride it free and so at least once right Rich? At least So in the first year, Staten Island students have the benefit of many more rides, so with the changes that are being submitted today and all of the collaborative work we've done, I can fully support this project. | 14 | with low income to live in many places across the |
| 15 | city and so I'm a fan of a mix usage to bring the |
| 16 | benefits that comes as well but I think it's great |
| 17 | and particularly the AMI's that you have but that's |
| 18 | just my one concern and hopefully we can think about |
| 19 | those things as we move forward. |
