CHAIRPERSON DROMM: Good morning

everyone. My name is Daniel Dromm and I'm the Chairperson of the Education Committee of the New York City Council. I want to welcome everyone to today's hearings; we're going to do two tings, we're gonna do it in two parts. We have a vote on Council Member Crowley's legislation and that's going to be first and then we will go into the hearing; we'll take a very short break and then we'll go into the hearing on sex education in the public schools.

So right now I'm going to start with the legislation from... [background comment] hold on one second... 644-B, introduced by Council Member Crowley and it is a Local Law to amend the Administrative Code of the City of New York in relation to requiring the Department of Education to report information on physical education in New York City schools. And let me congratulate Council Member Crowley and also thank Council Member Crowley for allowing me to be second on this piece of legislation. But this was a vital piece of legislation that we heard, I believe it was last June, if I'm not mistaken, and as an outcome of that we were able to work with the administration on

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getting a number of new physical education teachers and physical education programs put into the budget and so the results of your hard work are already seen and noticed and we look forward to getting the reporting back on this bill as well. So thank you Council Member Crowley and I know that you also wanted to make a statement before we go to the vote.

COUNCIL MEMBER CROWLEY: Thank you
Chairman Dromm, thank you for your leadership on this
bill and to all the members of the Education
Committee; I'm pleased that we are voting on this
physical education reporting bill that will
ultimately enhance physical education programs in our
city schools. Currently the Department of Education
does not report on whether or not a school complies
with the State physical education requirements and so
we as elected leaders or parents have no idea whether
their children are receiving the public physical
education that they deserve.

I remember being frustrated as a public school parent and this bill is just simply about fairness; too many of our children are being denied the physical education that they deserve; students in low-income areas are disproportionately affected by

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this and as a result we are seeing an increase in childhood and teen obesity; physical education is a critical step in combating this. This bill establishes a comprehensive reporting requirement which ranges from the amount of gym time students receive at each grade level and information about the physical spaces that they are using for physical education, and just how many full- and part-time certified physical education instructors are employed at each school in our city.

I'd like to thank again Council Member

Dromm for his leadership; I'd like to also thank City

Comptroller who recently published a report on how

many kids in our city just are not getting the

physical education that they deserve, as well as all

the advocacy groups, from Physical Education for All

Coalition, New York Lawyers for the Public Interest,

the American Heart Association and so many more. So

I'd also like to thank Committee Counsel Aysha

Schomburg for her help on this legislation as well.
