CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Good morning and welcome as we reopen this meeting of the City Council Committee on Rules, Privileges and Elections. I'm Brad Lander, Chair of the Committee, joined this morning by Council Members Rafael Espinal, Mark Levine, Ydanis Rodriguez, Minority Leader Steven Matteo, Council Member Margaret Chin, Council Member Debi Rose, and a few others will be joining us as well. Thanks very much to our Counsel, Abid Hossain and as always and especially this meeting, to the staff members from the Council's Investigative Unit -- Chuck Davis, Deandra [sp?] Johnson and Alicia Basel [sp?].

In a letter dated November 5, 2015, Mayor de Blasio submitted to the Council for advice and consent the name of Janet Alvarez for nomination appointment to the Tax Commission and we went over at that hearing the rules and responsibilities of the Tax Commission. If the Council gives its advice and consent, Ms. Alvarez, a Manhattan resident, will be eligible to fill a vacancy and complete the remainder of a six-year term that expires on January 6, 2018.

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We had two hearings with Ms. Alvarez; as members of this committee know, at the first we had some real concerns; we were aware of a legal proceeding about which we didn't have information and which she declined to provide information and in response to some questions about the proceedings of the Tax Commission, while we acknowledged she had a strong resume and legal background, we didn't feel that she had yet done the level of due diligence that we were hoping to see in a Tax Commission nominee.

We had a second hearing yesterday and it went much better, thanks to the work of both our investigative staff and in consultation with the Mayor's Office we found the complaint, which is a Small Claims Court complaint of negligence and really something quite typical that a lawyer might fact and nothing that cast any doubt or shadow on her integrity or fitness to serve or character. And in addition, Council Member Matteo, and he can speak to this as well, and I asked her some questions and it was clear that she has learned a lot about the Tax Commission in the last week and it was much more thoughtful about her experience and knowledge would be applied to her service on the Tax Commission, in

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ways that I feel comfortable will provide the
appropriate level of judgment, adjudication and
listening that we all expect for our constituents
when they appear before the Tax Commission with their
tax appeals.

Minority Leader Matteo, do you wanna reflect on that as well?

COUNCIL MEMBER MATTEO: Thank you, Mr. Chair. Yes, I agree with Chair Lander's assessment; the first hearing was obviously a much more difficult hearing, but after obviously having her prepped for the second hearing and answering our substantive questions by Chair Lander and Council Member Chin and I, I certainly feel much better about her qualifications about how she can represent our constituents in the Tax Commission, that she's willing to work with us, come out for hearings and try and make the process better for our constituents, which is an extremely important part of the job. it was a much better hearing; she provided much more substance than she did at the first hearing and with that I'm confident in moving forward with her nomination.
