2 CHAIR VACCA: Ok thank you. It is now  
3 11:00 on Tuesday and I will open up this meeting,  
4 December 15. This is the Committee on Technology.  
5 I'm James Vacca, Chair of the Committee and I want to  
6 welcome everyone here. Members who are here are  
7 Council Member Annabel Palma, Council Member Barry  
8 Grodenchik, me, Jimmy Vacca and David Greenfield to  
9 my extreme left and Joe Borelli to my left on the  
10 (inaudible) that is. We building on the great work  
11 today that this Committee has been able to accomplish  
12 over the past few months. Were here today to vote  
13 two additional bills that will remarkably strengthen  
14 our open data law. In October I held a hearing on 7  
15 open data bill and 5 of those were passed into law  
16 just a couple of weeks ago. The 2 bills before us  
17 today required more time and attention and I'm proud  
18 of the product and the hard work of the Committee. I  
19 am proud sponsor one piece of legislation considered  
20 today, Intro 916-A, which would require a series of  
21 examinations and verification on the compliance of  
22 agencies with the open data law public data set  
23 requirement. Additionally we will vote on Council  
24 Member Palma's bill, Intro 908-A, which would require  
25 agencies to review freedom of information law request

2 that includes the release of data for inclusion of  
3 that data on the open data portal. I'd like thank  
4 Council Member Palma for working on this important  
5 legislation with me. It is an important priority of  
6 the Committee on Technology to keep improving the  
7 open data law and we will continue to move toward  
8 this goal.

10 CHAIR VACCA: The previous five bills  
11 that were just put into law will remedy issue that  
12 have been brought up time and time again when we have  
13 discussed open data. User friendliness, data  
14 retention, public responsiveness and the timeliness  
15 of updated data sets. Today's legislation goes even  
16 further. Taking steps to integrate foil request into  
17 open data and most importantly improving compliance  
18 across the board. My bill Intro 916-A, which would  
19 require the administration to conduct a series of  
20 examinations and verifications on the compliance of  
21 agencies with the open data laws public set data  
22 requirement is an essential component of improving  
23 the open data law. In government we sometimes say  
24 the trying to get coordination across many offices is  
25 like hurting cats. Currently DOIT is tasked with

2 getting the data that falls under the open data law  
3 from every City agency. There dozens of agencies,  
4 each with different staff resources, different types  
5 of data, and varying amounts of data. It is an  
6 overwhelming duty and compliance is going to be  
7 difficult. Research from this committee has led to  
8 the discovery of the exclusion of much data that  
9 should be included on the portal. For example 311  
10 referral data and complaint data from the Mayor's  
11 Office of Media and Entertainment but this process of  
12 random discovery is not official. There may be more  
13 public data sets that have been excluded and there  
14 needs to be a systematic way to address this.

15 Developing a compliance examination approve by the  
16 Department of Investigation is the tool that we need  
17 to inform all the relevant entities what is missing.  
18 Council Member Palma's bill, Intro 908-A will enable  
19 better coordination when it comes to foil request and  
20 the data that is available on open data. For a while  
21 advocates had pointed out that data requested as part  
22 of a foil request is often times already available on  
23 open data and that there can be significate savings  
24 in time and effort for both the public and for foil  
25 officers. However, it has been recognized but this

2 committee that foil request can be a tool for  
3 identifying data that has been incorrectly excluded  
4 from open data or which might not be required to be  
5 posted under current law but still merit voluntary  
6 posting due to public demand. Intro 908 would  
7 require agencies to review responses to foil request  
8 that could be included on the open data portal. Both  
9 bills have improved since our initial hearing and  
10 much time and energy has gone into this. I want to  
11 thank Brad Reid, Counsel to my Committee, my Deputy  
12 Chief of Staff, Stacey Gardner and the  
13 representatives in the Mayor's Office, DOIT and MODA  
14 who took the time to carefully craft each bill. With  
15 that I'd like to call on any colleagues who wish to  
16 speak and I recommend a yes vote on each bill.  
17 Council Member Palma do you wish to say anything? Ok.  
18 Ok Council Member Palma waves her right a sponsor,  
19 thank you. We will now call the roll, no other  
20 speakers evidencing themselves, please call the roll.

21 COMMITTEE CLERK: Matthew DeStephino  
22 (sp), Committee on Technology, roll call on Intro  
23 908-A and 916-A. Chair Vacca.

24 CHAIR VACCA: I vote I on both.

25 COMMITTEE CLERK: Palma.

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2 COUNCIL MEMBER PALMA: I vote I,  
3 congratulations Mr. Chair on the passage of these two  
4 important pieces of legislation.

5 CHAIR VACCA: Congratulations to you.

6 COMMITTEE CLERK: Greenfield.

7 COUNCIL MEMBER GREENFIELD:  
8 Congratulation Council Member Palma and Chair Vacca.  
9 I vote I on all.

10 COMMITTEE CLERK: Grodenchik.

11 COUNCIL MEMBER GRODENCHIK: I on all.

12 COMMITTEE CLERK: Borelli.

13 COUNCIL MEMBER BORELLI: I on all. Can  
14 you please add my name to the Palma bill as well.

15 COMMITTEE CLERK: By a vote of 5 in the  
16 affirmative, 0 in the negative and no abstentions,  
17 the items have been adopted.

18 CHAIR VACCA: The items being adopted it  
19 is now 10 after 11:00, there being no further  
20 speakers or business before this Committee today,  
21 this meeting is adjourned.
