PATRICIA VALENCIA: Okay. Good morning.
My name is Patricia Valencia. I own Cafe Cortadito.
I'm here to make just a couple of mentions. I know
this Councilwoman has recommended to not having my
sidewalk cafe any more, but I had an issue a few
months ago with a lady that came to Cafe Cortadito to
dine, and she request a bigger table. I was unable
to give her because I was extremely busy. So she get
up and without paying the bill, she left the
restaurant and I hadI had to go outside, and say,
listen, you have to pay thethe bill. So sheshe
started things that I was rude, and I was racist,
that she's going to do whatever it takes for herfor
me to lose my license, my sidewalk license. And she
said I hate you, I hate you, and she walked away.
Three weeks ago, I had a meeting with Mr. Matthew
Viggiano (sic) at his office and when I went, I
opened the door and I see this woman, the woman that
she said that she hate me and she's going to do
whatever it takes for me to lose my license.

My dream--I'm from El Salvador. I'm the chef 14 15 and owner of Cafe Cortadito. 16 CHAIRPERSON RICHARDS: Can you speak of 17 where you grew up? 18 RICARDO ARIAS: I grew up in Brooklyn. 19 CHAIRPERSON RICHARDS: Bedford 20 Stuyvesant. We could barely--some things I see back in the '80s in a really bad, bad neighborhood. My 21 2.2 dream always was, you know, to get over it when I 2.3 grew up, and I become a chef. I worked for 20 years

at Victor's Cafe, a very popular Cuban restaurant in

the city. Then me and my wife decide to open a small

COUNCIL MEMBER REYNOSO: And there's an attempt to close all the sidewalk cafes. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON RICHARDS: Well, I want to thank you for coming, and certainly we're sensitive to small business here in this committee. We work very hard to ensure that, you know, communities and small businesses certainly can work together to both, you know, support a good quality of life so the businesses do well, but also the quality of life in the neighborhood. So I know Council Member Mendez had in particular some issue. I know she's pointed it out, and I know we are joined by one of her staffer today who will certainly go through the testimony. I would just -- so I'm -- I'm going to go to Council Member Williams in a second, but I know that there--you know, you're obviously a very successful, from what I hear, restaurant. And I'm very happy that you at least admitted on the record that there some things that, you know, that your--yourbusiness was doing that obviously was not, you know, the wishes of the community, and perhaps Council -- and obviously Council--

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CHAIRPERSON RICHARDS: --Member Mendez as well. So, I would just say as we move forward, you know, in--you know, her staffer is here. I would suggest you speak to him before you leave today so that you can really start to work to ensuring that this application eventually can move forward because unfortunately, this committee has always going to support the local members' wishes. They know their communities best. I don't want to get into the personal, you know, the -- whatever happened there, but there are some things that we see--clearly see in the picture that we've seen that Council Mendez admitted that surely you have not been in compliance with-with certain--the community's request and--and some--So I would just suggest that we move forward with that happening. PATRICIA VALENCIA: Only one in 2014 for having extra tables. I--from 2011 to 2015, I have four. Out of those four, it was three minus. It was one because the railing was too high. So I had to

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replace them, and the other one was there was no sign for--for dis--disabled people, and I also got a ramp in--in--in the side. And the other one was one Saturday an inspector came, and he gave me a ticket for the extra tables. And the last one that I had was December 15th because I--I closed the sidewalk because if you noticed the window of my restaurant is very weak. So it's a lot of---they--in the heat and--and the--the--and the service plan doesn't work. it's too cold, and when the inspector came he said that that was an enclose, and it has to removed right away. I--I paid \$4,000 to have that built, and then in order to remove it was another \$895, and there's a \$1,000 fine that I got. I explained just--and takes and the things pay less than 60, \$60,000. (sic) And-and--but I asked the--the gentleman that built the enclosed--I got some. I didn't know it was enclosed. I asked him do you think this fine? And he said everybody has it. If you walk around the city, everybody has even bigger that the one I had everywhere, everywhere.

PATRICIA VALENCIA: Well, there was times that like I said it was so busy that sometimes you don't think, and you--you don't want to lose your customers. You don't want them to go to the next establishment because I don't have tables or I don't have the space. And you have, you know, you--you--you made a mistake, but honestly if I did it, I did it probably only in the weekends, never on weekends because there's nobody coming because they always sat. The--the--on the weekends, is when you tried to make your money out and, you know, because during the week it's--it's empty.

COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS: So I think that's--that's what the issue is. I think it happened multiple times from--from what we've heard, and you're kind of agreeing that this happened multiple times. So I just want to make sure, you--you--

PATRICIA VALENCIA: [interposing] All--

25 all, I'm saying is--

2 COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS: Let me just

3 finish.

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PATRICIA VALENCIA: Oh, I'm so sorry.

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COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS: I'm just saying it just seems it happened multiple times over a long time period, but you may not get the result you want here, but it's not because people are really not considering what you're saying. It's just the length of time this has been happening. I do have a couple of violations that were given to me, four of them. It seems that three of them were for some type of unlicensed activity. At least two of them explicitly say it was either tables or an enclosed cafe in terms of expanding what you're trying to do. So it seems that this has been happening for quite some time. I'm not sure about the meetings, but I know that the Council Member has gone and visited. Members of the staff here have gone and visited. So it seems there was a lot of attempts to try to get the activity to stop, and that -- that never happened.

PATRICIA VALENCIA: She never came to my establishment to have a meeting. She only came once and she started screaming at me in front of the customers, and she was pointing at me and she was

here is that you're--you're operating illegally.

16 I know how busy it gets, and it's been a great 17 experience every time I go. So I'm not going to take 18 away from the experience and the food, which is 19 great, but I do think that you guys are ignoring your 20 fault here. I think you're putting a lot of onus on 21 Councilwoman Mendez, but you make it easy for any 2.2 Council Member to go to your establishment and see 2.3 that there's something wrong. Is there an opportunity here for you guys to think about 24 withdrawing your application, beginning to comply 25

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with--three tables is what you're allowed, and you guys have more like six tables here. In the picture there's no aisle for a waiter or for somebody with a wheelchair to pass through on the -- in the sidewalk cafe. You guys are just operating illegally. money can't be more important than the overall business, and you guys are not taking that into account. And today, you're jeopardizing a money maker that you have in the sidewalk cafe because you just don't obey laws. You just don't obey laws. completely ignore the for money, and you can't do that. So what I'm going to recommend is that you consider withdrawing your application because it's going to get denied if you don't. I just want to let you know. From what I'm hearing right now, you're-it's going to get denied. SO I would recommend that you withdraw and resubmit the application. with Council Member Rosie Mendez and start complying with the law. It's very simple. You guys have to comply with the law, and I'm trying to be helpful in letting you know that you should withdraw because if not, it's too obvious that you guys are doing the wrong thing. You're making mistakes I think just because you don't have lawyers that are supposed to

I know that she has a lot of applications. You're not the first ones. So I don't want you to feels sorry as if you're being targeted. We get a lot of her cafes. They have issues. work through them, and she's always been gracious in working with the local businesses to ensure that the--the benefit for the community with their--the--the things in the best interest of the community would certainly solvable. 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parents pushing a stroller, for seniors with walkers, for people in wheelchairs, even residents just trying to get home or making their way to the new Greek (sic) and Poet Cafe nearby. Approximately two years ago, the Councilwoman and other pedestrians were traveling eastbound on 3rd Street, and were forced to jump into a tree pit and off the curb so as not to collide with a pregnant who was pushing a stroller and was traveling westbound on East 3rd Street. addition, last year the Councilwoman saw the wheels of an individual traveling westbound in a motorized wheelchair almost fall into a tree pit because there's not enough sidewalk space for the individual to safely travel East 3rd Street. Now, a revocable consent is a -- for a sidewalk cafe is a privilege. This establishment has shown no regard for that privilege as will be described by resident and the Community Board District Manager who--who sits beside Please listen to their experience and their comments. Copies of notices of the violation issued by the Department of Consumer Affairs are also available for your review. I understand that this street allows sidewalk cafes as a permissible use. However, based on the evidence at hand, the testimony

cafe was put on the agenda. We contacted the owner.

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We have in writing from her, which I have with me that she would attend the meeting. She did not show up for the meeting. She did not call and let us know she was not coming to the meeting. She showed up in the office the day after the meeting and said among other things that she had no idea she could not expand her sidewalk cafe in front of the garden because the people in the garden had given her permission. I explained to her that she had an approved plan, that she had to follow the approved plan, and she said from now on now that she understood that she would do so. On November 7th, about a--almost a month later, not quite a month later, I was in front of her sidewalk cafe with a Department of Health person on a site visit. observed that she was again in front of the garden. I went in and found her and spoke to her. She and I spoke, and I said, you now understand. You know you can't do this. Why are you continuing to do this? And her answer was she would tell her waiter not to do it again. I said that's not an answer. You have been continually explained you cannot do this. are you continuing to do this? And her answer was again, I will tell the waiter not to do it. So she

council Member Reynoso: Listen, I'm just saying I did think--Well, I--I want to be sympathetic here. I want to assist businesses and their ability to do well, but it's just a complete disregard for compliances. It's--it doesn't seem like there's an effort to be laid here, and I want to be helpful, but it just seems like they're ignoring it all for all for money ultimately is what I'm seeing. Is there an opportunity for them to reapply for the application, have a conversation with you guys and see if they can comply?
