CHAIR CROWLEY: Good morning, my name is Elizabeth Crowley, I am the Chair of the Fire and Criminal Justice Services Committee. Today the Committee will hold a vote on proposed Introduction 763-A.

Year after year violence on Rikers Island continue, continues to increase. We have held numerous hearings regarding violence within DOC and this Committee and Council is committed to working the department to improve the safety conditions by holding DOC accountable for the violence rates. Quite clearly the public reporting of violence is essential for the Council and public to monitor and understand the conditions that both staff and inmates at Rikers and DOC facilities face every day. Local law 29 of 2009 required the DOC to issue detailed quarterly reports on violence for adolescence inmates which has provided valuable insight into conditions for adolescence at Rikers Island. This coupled with the Federal Government investigation to the treatment of adolescence has led to reforms that have brought about fewer incidents of violence. Introduction 763-A will expand on these recording, reporting requirements. Brining detailed reporting on violence at DOC facilities to all inmates, adults and adolescence alike. In fact 763-A will not only show key violence rates for all DOC inmates, it will also break down these rates for adolescences, adults and critically young adults aged 18-21. The DOC has recently made significant efforts to address the 18 to 21 year old population who unfortunately account for a disproportionate amount of violence in DOC facilities. This bill will allow all of us to monitor the DOC's efforts to address this crucial inmate population.

monthly reporting on 7 crucial violence indicators.

Allowing the Council and the public to see violence trends as they develop and respond accordingly and the DOC will be required to compare each report to previous reporting periods so the trends will be immediately apparent, moreover, these reports will be required to be permanently stored on the DOC website allowing a wide range of historic analyst. Finally while the Federal Government has focused on the issue of unwarranted use of force by staff on inmates, this Council has maintained an equal focus on the wellbeing of DOC staff. As rates of inmates violence

3	continues to rise. This bill will require regular
4	reporting on not only assaults on staff and how many
5	of these assaults lead to serious injuries and
6	hospitalizations and will also require reports on
7	inmates splashing officers. A disturbing recent
8	trend that cannot be tolerated. I look forward to
9	voting to pass this bill through this Committee today
10	and I would like to thank Council Member Julissa
11	Ferreras-Copeland for sponsoring this bill and
12	helping the Council address the critical violence at
13	Rikers Island and DOC facilities. I also want to
14	thank my staff and the Committee staff and the staff
15	who helped draft this bill. Now I would like to call
