of a training coordinator who shall provide

coordination, direction and guidance with respect to

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training on the best practice for identifying
runaway, homeless or sexually exploited youth and
connecting these young people to the appropriate
services. This training must be held annually for
individuals whose position involve regular contact
with young people at the Administration for

Children's Services, Department of Parks and

9 Recreation, Department of Homeless Services, and the

10 Human Resources Administration/Department of Social

11 Services.

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Also, as a condition of contracting with those agencies, contractors and service providers shall provide the same training to their own employees whose position involve regular contact with young people. The coordinator will also be responsible for outreach to other entities, such as the Department of Education, the Police Department, the Department of Probation, health clinics, libraries, and hospitals, including emergency rooms. The coordinator will encourage [inaudible] entity to consider holding training when it would be appropriate for their personnel.

The second bill was introduced by Council Member Levin and I, Proposed Int. 0993-A, to amend

the Administrative Code of the City of New York in relation to changing the date of an annual report related to sexually exploited children.

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This law will require the annual report required by Local Law 23 of 2013 prepared by the Administration for Children's Services and the Department of Youth and Community Development to be submitted no later than April 30th of this year and then annually therefore no later than April 1st instead of January 1st and to be posted on the website of both city agencies. The report documents the number of youth in contact with both agencies while referred as [inaudible] report as the department ACS later determined to be sexually exploited children. The bill was also drafted to address administration concern about age aggregation.

I am proud to be a co-sponsor on this bill and I would like to encourage my colleagues to support them both and I'd like to thank all the members of the Youth Services Committee and especially Council Member Levin for his dedication to this community.
