CHAIRPERSON CORIOSO(?): Good morning
everyone. Let me try that again. So that's, the
gavel thing. Thanks everybody for coming out this
morning on this exciting election day. Today,
although we are here to vote on a proposal and to
propose Introduction 1004-A, a local law which
repeals Section 22505 of the administrative code of
the City of New York relating to displaced building
service workers. When passed these changes will
strengthen displaced building workers protection act
that discounts would pay us back in 2002. This law
requires that a new owner of a building property must
retain the building service staff for 90 days after
the property has been purchased. At this time the
owner must conduct evaluations and offer employment
to those of the new owner believes should stay on.
These new protections will continue the success of
the law while increasing the protection for these
workers. Too many times as elected officials, we
have heard stories about hard working New Yorker's
losing their job simply because the new management
company has replaced the old one. During the

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previous hearing we had legislation, per legislation and other elected officials, advocates, and organizations along with labor testify how this law has sought out what was meant to do, reduce the high turnover rate of contractors and sub-contracted industry. The increased protection we are voting on today will expand the definition of employers to include security officers and fire safety directors, increase the salary cap to cover workers who earn over \$25.00 per hour to \$35.00 per hour, include buildings that are over 35,000 square feet, ensure all buildings that the City lease is covered, extend protections to sub-contractors who are working on buildings during the time it is sold and a worker will be able to receive more than 90 days of back pay if he or she is out of work after evaluation process has been completed. I would like to thank the members of the committee, council member Constance Constantinites(?) and council member Drum(?) and I would certainly like to thank the council, Matt Carlin(?) and Mr. Zoloft(?) there our analyst and Thank you for your work on this very, very important and we have been at this for about two years. So thank you for everyone's due diligence in
