2	CHAIRPERSON FERRERAS-COPELAND: Good
3	morning and welcome to today's Finance Committee
4	hearing; I'm Council Member Julissa Ferreras-
5	Copeland; I chair the committee. We've been joined
6	by Council Members Matteo, Cornegy, Johnson,
7	Rosenthal, and Van Bramer.
8	Today we have two LU items on the agenda,
9	but before we turn to those items I'd like to take
10	this opportunity to say goodbye and good luck to an
11	integral member of the Finance team, Miss Tanisha
12	Edwards, Chief Counsel of the Finance Division is
13	leaving the Council tomorrow, after over nine years
14	of service. She will be heading to the Governor's
15	Office, where she will be an Assistant Counsel to
16	Governor Cuomo, [background comments] covering the
17	areas of taxation and financial services.
18	During her time at the Council, Tanisha
19	was instrumental in the Finance Division's growth,
20	setting legislative policy for the Council and the
21	City as a whole. Her work includes passage of the
22	Prevailing Wage Act, the Responsible Banking Act and
23	tax lien sale reform. She has drafted over 200
24	pieces of local legislation, [background comment]
25	over 50 pieces of state legislation and to date has

2	been the only attorney at the Council to have
3	successfully defended in federal court legislation
4	that was negotiated and drafted by her. [applause]
5	She has spent countless hours advising and developing
6	legislation and policy proposals with council
7	members, their staff and numerous advocates
8	throughout the years, as well as three Finance
9	Committee chairs, two Speakers, the General Counsel's
10	Office and the Legislative Division.
11	On a personal note, Tanisha, your
12	guidance and your friendship over the past several
13	years has been invaluable and you will be sorely
14	missed; although we wish you would stay, you have an
15	amazing opportunity and journey ahead of you and we
16	know that you will sure be successful there as you
17	are here, plus, it never hurts to have a friend in
18	Albany.
19	I hope everyone can join us at 5 p.m.
20	this afternoon at Barleycorn around the corner to
21	toast Tanisha and her sendoff in style. With that
22	said, please let's give Miss Tanisha Edwards another
23	big round of applause.

2	And you have till 4:45 to change your
3	mind.
4	Let's turn to the LU items for today.
5	The first item is 810 River Avenue in the Speaker's
6	district in the Bronx, which is a new construction
7	that will create 134 units of affordable housing for
8	low-income households. Today's resolution would make
9	a technical correction to a resolution passed by the
10	Council in 20 woo, my phone's back in 2014 granting
11	this HDFC a full 40-year property tax exemption. The
12	2014 resolution referred to the Real Property Tax Law
13	rather than the private [background comments] shhhh
14	[background comments] the Private Housing Finance Law
15	and today's resolution would correct that reference.
16	The Speaker supports this action.
17	The second LU item is Calvary Baptist
18	Church Senior Housing in Council Member Wills'
19	district in Queens. This project will preserve 100

units of housing for low-income seniors and will receive a full 40-year property tax exemption through the City's HDFC program. Council Member Wills supports this project and has submitted a letter of support to the committee that will be included for the record.

2	Are there any particular questions on
3	these LU items? Seeing none, we have someone who's
4	come here to testify, Mr. Kent Garrett; if you can
5	come up. [background comments]
6	Good morning Mr. Garrett.
7	KENT GARRETT: My name is Kent A. Garrett
8	and I represent the Board of Directors at the Calvary
9	Baptist Senior Housing and our tax exempt has been in
10	question, 501(c)3, and we are in the process of
11	upgrading the building and doing the refinance and
12	the refinance companies want to know if we could have
13	a permanent one instead of extended to just the next
14	40 years that it had from the original one; that is
15	what we are seeking to get, a permanent 501(c)3 so
16	that we can proceed with the refinancing.
17	Are there any other questions?
18	CHAIRPERSON FERRERAS-COPELAND: [laugh]
19	Thank you, Mr. Garrett. Actually, you will be
20	getting a 40-year; that is the maximum amount of time
21	that we are able to authorize a tax exemption; we do
22	it for less, but this property has been granted
23	through this process and we're going to be voting
24	this out today; you're going to get the maximum
25	amount of time, which is 40 years.

5	could come back at the end of that [sic] [crosstalk]

7	back in 40 years… [laughter] I want you to come back
8	in 40 years and we'll be right here and approve it
9	again; okay…? [crosstalk]

13	leave a note for the next Council; that is a good
14	point… [crosstalk]

17	Member Miller would like to [background comments]
18	also speak.

20	want you to know [interpose, background comments]
21	Oh, I'm off the record; [background comments] I'm not
22	speaking about this; I just want you to know that the
23	gentleman who's speaking to you is Mr. Kent Garrett;
24	he is Chairman of the Board for our building but he's
25	also the Chairman of our Deacon Board at our church

3	know he's 93 years young. [background comments,
4	laughter, applause]

9	just wanna say a little about the Calvary Baptist
10	Grandparent housing program and what it has done for
11	our community over the last few years and the
12	excitement this latest project, their latest building
13	has brought and what it has done for senior housing
14	in our community has been great. Deacon, it is
15	wonderful to see you down here again pass the hall;
16	thank you for coming down and thank you for the work
17	that you're doing within the community among senior
18	housing and grandparent housing; it is unique,
19	obviously there's always some kinds that have to be
20	worked out and the 40 years may be one of them, but I
21	am certainly going to be voting to, along with
22	Council Member Wills and others, to approve this
23	project and I would implore my colleagues to do the
24	same. So thank you so much for coming down
