CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: Good afternoon.

My name is David Greenfield; I'm the Council Member from the 44th Council District in Brooklyn; I'm privileged to serve as the Chair of the Land Use Committee.

I want to welcome my esteemed colleagues who are members of the committee here today, Council Member Gentile, who gets the gold star, Council Member Dickens, Council Member Mealy, Council Member Mendez, Council Member Koo, Council Member Rose, Council Member Richards, Council Member Barron, Council Member Cohen, Council Member Kallos, and Council Member Torres.

I wanna thank Chair Dickens for her work with the Planning Subcommittee on Tuesday and Chair Richards for conducting our meetings and hearing this week in the Zoning Subcommittee, and Chair Koo, as always, for his leadership of the Landmarks Subcommittee.

The committee will be voting today on resolutions before you for presentation and vote by

the Full Council. We have seven applications from HPD; I will go through them briefly here, but the full details of each application are in front of you in your briefing sheets; the local council members are in support of all of these HPD applications.

LU Nos. 0350, 0351 and 0352, Caribe

Gardens in Brooklyn. These related applications were submitted by HPD pursuant to the Private Housing

Finance Law for approval of a modification of an existing plan, the conveyance of property from the current owner to a new owner and the extension of a previously approved real property tax exemption for properties located in Council Member Reynoso's district.

Caribe Gardens is an existing affordable housing development financed by project-based Section 8 Vouchers; these approvals would facilitate the sale of two portions of the property for new development; that would include 28 percent of the floor area as affordable. The sale of portions of the property would also help to finance the continued affordability of the existing Section 8 units, as well as improvements to the existing buildings and property. LU 0357, Madison Street Cluster. This is an application for approval of tax exemption pursuant to Article XI of the Private Housing Finance Law for properties located in Council Member Cornegy's district of the Brooklyn. This application will facilitate the preservation of approximately 102 units of affordable housing.

LU No. 0364, 775 Jennings Street. This is an application for approval of a tax exemption pursuant to Section 577 of the Private Housing

Finance Law for property located in Council Member

Gibson's district in the Bronx. This application

will support the preservation of approximately 13

units of affordable housing.

LU 0365, Grand & Rogers Cluster. This is an application for approval of tax exemption pursuant to Section 577 of the Private Housing Finance Law for property located in The Speaker's district and in Council Member Salamanca's district and in Council Member Gibson's district. This application is a correction to the Certificate of Occupancy language in a previously approved tax exemption.

Preconsidered LU, 1370 Lyman Place. This is an application for approval of an Urban

Development Action Area Program under Article XVI of the General Municipal Law for property located in Council Member Gibson's district in the Bronx. This application will facilitate the preservation of two affordable apartments.

Preconsidered LU, Gladys Hampton House is an application for approval of a tax exemption pursuant to Section 577 of the Private Housing Finance Law for property located in Council Member Dickens' district in Manhattan. This application will support the preservation of approximately 204 units of affordable housing.

Preconsidered LU, New West II Apartments.

This is an application for approval of a tax

exemption pursuant to Section 577 of the Private

Housing Finance Law for property located in Council

Member Dickens' district in Manhattan. This

application will support the preservation of

approximately 74 units of affordable housing.

Finally we have two items from the Zoning Subcommittee, LU 0363, 3276 Jerome Avenue. This is an application by Mosholu Petro, LLC for an amendment to the zoning map change in existing R8 district into a C8-2 district for the property located in Council

Member Cohen's district in the Bronx. This rezoning would allow its existing commercial use to continue; the Council Member supports approval of this application and the Subcommittee recommended approval as well and Preconsidered LU, Oxford Nursing Home.

recommended earlier in the morning disapproval of two related applications for a zoning map amendment and a zoning text amendment to facilitate the development of a nursing home in the Red Hook neighborhood of Brooklyn. These applications are for properties located in Council Member Menchaca's district. I know we have met with the applicant many times to discuss the issues and after long deliberation remain apposed to this project. I will now turn it over to Council Member Menchaca for a statement on these two applications.

this particular application for a while now and the

land use process ends today essentially with a

mountain of just good information that we've been

able to kind of talk through this whole process and

with that I wanna say thank you to 1199, their

workers and their leadership for continuing to have conversations with us in the City Council, Oxford and the Braunstein family, they're committed, without any doubt, I think, making sure that the nursing business that they have in this for-profit business continues to thrive. And I also wanna say thank you to all the residents out there that continue to engage in this process throughout this very democratic ULURP process.

And finally, I wanna kind of echo some of the things that have been said in the hearings.

We're not opposed to nursing homes; we're not opposed to workers; this is not a labor issue; this is about making the right choice about where to site a future nursing home and we've gotta do it in the best place possible. So many people in Red Hook experienced a very traumatic experience, including in testimony from a lot of the workers who were part of a receiving end of nursing patients from across other flood-zone-prone nursing homes and the trauma they experienced as well. We have an opportunity here to do the right thing; we're doing the right thing; it is not an easy thing, but we're creating precedent that allows us to move forward in a visionary way

post Sandy and I'm very thankful for all the Council
Members that are gonna be standing with me today;
this is not gonna be easy, but it's the right thing
to do and we, not just me, we there are so many
people who are on your side to continue this journey
to site you in a place that makes sense and that
keeps our most vulnerable populations, like our
seniors who are medically their medical conditions,
to put them in the best place possible; they deserve
that and we're gonna do that together. Thank you.
