Every year the Banking Commission provides recommendations to the Council relating to the discount of property owners who pay their property taxes early and the interest rates for property owners who pay their property taxes and water charges late.

For Fiscal 2017, the Banking Commission has made the following recommendations: one-half percent discount rate for individuals who pay their property taxes early and a 7.5 percent interest rate for late property taxes for properties with an assessed value of \$250,000 or less, which accounts for about 97 percent of all Class 1 properties in the city and 90 percent of all property in the city, and 18 percent interest rate for late property taxes for properties with an assessed value of more than \$250,000 and a 9.5 percent interest rate for late water charges.

After careful consideration of the Banking Commission's recommendations, the Council is recommending that one-half percent discount rate and 18 percent property tax late payment rate for properties with assessed values of more than \$250,000

be adopted as per the Banking Commission's
recommendation.

With respect to the interest rate for the property... shhhh... guys... with the interest rate for the late property taxes for properties with an assessed value of \$250,000 or less, the Council is recommending the rate to bet set at 6 percent. By setting a slightly lower interest rate, the Council hopes to provide a measure of relief for homeowners across the city who may be struggling to afford their rising property taxes while still providing a sufficient deterrent to would-be delinquent property taxpayers.

In addition, in order to maintain the same rate as was adopted last year, the Council recommends that the later water charge interest rate be set at 9 percent. Because of certain requirements in the current law, the Banking Commission is not authorized to recommend an interest rate less than 9.5 percent; I believe that the Banking Commission should have more flexibility and authority to be able to recommend whatever rate they think is appropriate and therefore, today I am introducing legislation

rates.

Now let's turn to the land use items. All seven land use items are seeking property tax exemption under the City's HDFC program and all are supported by their respective council members.

First we have the New West I in Council Member Dickens' district in Manhattan. This property will receive a partial 40-year exemption to preserve 98 units of affordable housing for low-income households.

Second, we have Riverview I in Council Member Levine's district in Manhattan. This property will receive a partial 40-year exemption to preserve 110 units of affordable housing for low-income

preserve 63 units of affordable housing for low-income households.

Fourth, we have Story Avenue in Council Member Salamanca's district in the Bronx. This property will receive a full 40-year exemption to construct 212 units of affordable housing for low-and moderate-income households.

Fifth, we have the Norwood Gardens in Council Member Cohen's district in the Bronx. This property will receive a full 40-year exemption to construct 118 units of affordable housing for low-and moderate-income households.

Sixth, we have 491 Gerard in The Speakers' district in the Bronx. This property will receive a full 40-year exemption to construct 153 units of affordable housing for low- and moderate-income households.

And last, but not least, we have 147-20 94th Avenue in Council Member Miller's district in Queens [interpose, background comment]. Thank you, Council Member Lander. This property will receive a full 40-year exemption to construct 380 units of affordable housing for low- and moderate-income households.
