3	CHAIRPERSON FERRERAS-COPELAND: Good
4	morning and welcome to today's Finance Committee
5	hearing. I am Council Member Julissa Ferreras-
6	Copeland; I'm the Chair of the committee. We've been
7	joined by Majority Leader Van Bramer, Minority Leader
8	Matteo, Council Member Cornegy, Council Members
9	Miller, Levine, and others will be joining us
10	shortly.
11	Today we have 11 land use items on the
12	agenda; the first nine are seeking a property tax
13	exemption under the City's HDFC program and the last
14	two would make technical amendments to resolutions
15	previously approved by the Council to grant
16	exemptions. All the actions we are voting on today
17	are supported by the respective council members.
18	First, we have 603 Pontiac Place in The
19	Speaker's district in the Bronx. This property will
20	receive a full 40-year exemption to construct 25
21	units of affordable housing.
22	Second, we have Story Avenue West in
23	Council Member Salamanca's district in the Bronx.
24	This property will receive a 40-year exemption for
25	construction of 223 units of affordable housing.

2	Third, we will have Montauk Apartments in
3	Council Member Miller's district in Queens. This
4	property will receive a partial 40-year exemption to
5	preserve 130 units of affordable housing.
6	The fourth through ninth land use items
7	are all in Council Member Cumbo's district in
8	Brooklyn and would all receive full 30-year
9	exemptions to preserve affordable housing in exchange
10	for the exemptions 480 St. Marks Avenue will
11	preserve 71 units; 500 St. Marks Avenue will preserve
12	65 units; 523 Prospect Place will preserve 83 units;
13	545 Prospect Place will preserve 159 units; 565
14	Prospect Place will preserve 86 units, and 713
15	Classon Avenue will preserve 76 units.
16	Next we will have Norwood Gardens in
17	Council Member Cohen's district in the Bronx. Last
18	month the Council approved a full 40-year exemption
19	property to property [sic] and today we will be
20	amending that resolution to clarify the purpose for
21	which the community facility space may be used in
22	order to qualify for the exemption; specifically, the
23	space must be used to house a job counseling or
24	training service providers, a pre-kindergarten or day

2	care or a senior center or a federally-qualified
3	health center.
4	And last but not least, we have Seagirt
5	Housing in Council Member Richards' district in
6	Queens. In 2009, the Council approved a partial 30-
7	year exemption for the property and today we will be
8	amending the resolution to correct the section of the
9	law under which the exemption was granted.
10	Those are our items for today. Does
11	anyone have any questions? Seeing none, I will ask
12	the committee clerk, Billy Martin, to please call the
13	roll.
