CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: Good morning. My name is David Greenfield. I am the Councilman from the 44th Council District in Brooklyn. privileged to serve as the chair of the Land Use Committee. I want to welcome my esteemed colleagues who are members of the committee, Council Member Gentile, Council Member Palma, Council Member Dickens, Council Member Garodnick, Council Member Mendez, Council Member Koo, Council Member Lander, Council Member Levin, Council Member Williams, Council Member Wills, Council Member Richards, Council Member Cohen, Council Member Kallos, Council Member Reynoso, Council Member Torres and Council Member Treyger. As always, I want to thank Chair Dickens, Chair Richards and Chair Koo for their work at chairing their respective subcommittees. There are three resolutions before, which represent the recommendations of the subcommittees for presentation to vote by the full council. [Shushing] Quiet on the set, please. [background comments] First up, we have seven sidewalk cafes.

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LU No. 435, Wine 34, and application for an unenclosed sidewalk café at 127 East 34th Street in Council Member Mendez's district.

LU No, 436, Duke of Montrose, an application for an unenclosed cafe located in 47 5th Avenue in Council Member Lander's district.

LU No. 459, Le Pinta Mexican Cuisine, an application at 711 West 181st Street in Council Member Rodriguez's district.

LU NO. 460, an application at 483

Amsterdam Avenue in Council Member Rosenthal's district. Folks, if would can use our inner voices today being a first day of school and all. LU No. 460, an application at 483 Amsterdam Avenue in Council Member Rosenthal's district.

LU No, 461 Haru, an application for a small unenclosed sidewalk café at 176 8th Avenue in Council Member Johnson's district.

LU No. 462, Benva Bakery, an application at 440 Amsterdam Avenue in Council Member Rosenthal's district.

LU No. 463, Bill's Bar & Burger, an application at 22 9th Avenue in Council Member Johnson's district.

And then we have 1//5 Grand Concourse in
Bronx Community Board 5, which is an application
submitted by 1775 Grand Concourse, LLC for amendment
of the Zoning Resolution to permit indirectly
illuminated signs on Grand Concourse street frontage
of a specified commercial in full size, and that sign
will affect approximately 17 buildings. This
application is in Council Member Cabrera's district.

LU No. 437, 625 West 47th (sic), an application submitted by Durst Pyramid, LLC for an amendment of the Zoning Resolution to allow an order of use in an existing building. This application is in Council Member Rosenthal's district.

LU No. 439, 38th Street and 31st Avenue, rezoning, an application submitted by 30-70 Astoria, LLC for an amendment to the zoning map to change an R5B district to an R6B on property roughly bounded by 38th Street, 31st Avenue and a line midway between 37th Street and 38th Avenue. This application is Council Member Constantinides' district.

LU No. 432, East Houston Rezoning in Council Mendez's district was withdrawn and therefore is subject to a motion to file.

Next up we have eight proposed Landmark
designations. Once again, the bulk of these
designations are because of the legislation that was
sponsored by Chair Koo and myself, which is finally
dealing with approximately 100 items that have been
backlogged for the last 50 years, and most of these
items, in fact, are being landmarked. The Church of
St. Joseph of the Holy Family. The proposed
designation of the St. Joseph of the Holy Family
located at 401 to 403 West 125th Street as a historic
landmark in Council Member Levine's district.

LU No. 441 Saint Paul Roman Catholic Church, the designation of Saint Paul Catholic Church located at Block 1645, Lot 7 in part. This is in the Speaker's district.

LU No. 442, the former firehouse Engine Company 29 located at 160 Chambers Street. The building is in Council Member Chin's district.

LU No. 443, the designation of 315

Broadway Building. This building is also in Council

Member Chin's district.

The next three items are all in Council Member Rose's district.

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LU No. 444, George William and Anna
Curtis House, the proposed designation of George
William and Anna Curtis' house located at 234 Bard
Avenue.

LU No. 445, the proposed designation of St. John's Protestant Episcopal Church Rectory located at 1333 Bay Street.

LU No. 460-446, the proposed designation of 92 Harrison Street House located incidentally at 92 Harrison Street.

LU No. 447, the proposed designation of the Princes Bay Lighthouse Complex located at 6204 Hylan Boulevard. This application is in Council Member Borelli's district.

And finally, the grand finale. We have a very significant application that was voted out by our Planning Subcommittee yesterday and that is LU Nos. 448 to 452, La Cent Traub (sic). This is a complex application with a series of actions including the UDAP designation and disposition of city-owned property, a rezoning to a C6-2- C6-2 text amendment to apply to the MAH program and two special permits for broke (sic) and use waivers. But all these actions will facilitate the construction of a

100% affordable housing project containing almost
1,000 units of affordable housing, 831 affordable
apartments, 160 supportive housing units, commercial
space, a new YMCA, new open space including a skate
park in the Melrose section of the Bronx. This
project is truly a mixed-income project with AMIs
ranging from 30% of the area median income to 130%
and will address the housing needs of a range of New
Yorkers. I want to congratulate Council Member
Salamanca on delivering this extraordinary project
for his community and for negotiating a significant
portion of the project, in fact, over 40% of this
projects is at or below 60 AMI, and that is in large
part due to the Council Member's insistence on having
a diversity of affordability at this project. I also
want to congratulate the very large development team,
and the Department of Housing and Preservation here
in New York City whose been working on this project
for quite a few years. This is really a significant
achievement of over 1,000 units of affordable
housing. Do any members have any questions or
remarks that they would like to make? Hearing none,
I will ask the clerk to call the roll.
