Control Board as the Noise Specialist. Should he be

appointed, he'll serve for the remainder of a four-

We had a hearing with Mr. Savitala in which I have to say it may be the best hearing in terms of just demonstrating pure qualifications for the job without any connection to anyone; he was reached out to by the administration because he's one of the people that has the noise qualifications and expertise that we need in this position; our only regret was we asked him some questions about how to solve the noise problems in New York City and he did not solve all of those problems in our short hearing, but his qualifications I would say were indisputable and [background comments] he was quiet even, so but uh. Alright, so I feel wholehearted in recommending an aye vote on Mr. Savitala. Are there any Council Members who wish to speak before we call the roll? [background comments] COUNCIL MEMBER GARODNICK: Mr. Chairman,

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COUNCIL MEMBER GARODNICK: Mr. Chairman, just a quick comment. First of all, I'm delighted to be joined by my son Asher today and thank you for recognizing him.

On this appointee, you know it is rare that you see a combination of expertise and the office for which they are appointed to be so well-

matched and in this case it was simply extraordinary; you have an acoustical engineer with an expertise in quiet being appointed to the Environmental Control Board. We have great expectations, we hope for great things; he seems also like a lovely guy and they should all be this easy. So thank you and I'm certainly gonna support him.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: And we don't have press here this morning, but I would... you know we always ask, either as part of our questions when we give pre-hearing questions or at the committee, how the person, you know became connected to the job; did someone reach out to them; did they reach out to someone, and usually, of course, there's some kind of connection like that; here he's on the list of people with the acoustical sound engineer expertise and the administration was looking for someone with that expertise and they called him because he was on that list and so that's a good story and hopefully it will help the Environmental Control Board rule effectively on noise complaints, which as Council Members know are in fact the number one 311 complaint to New York City and to our offices in many cases.
