2	CHAIRPERSON GIBSON: Good morning ladies
3	and gentlemen. Good morning colleagues. I am
4	Council Member Vanessa Gibson of the 16 th District,
5	and I'm proud to chair the Committee on Public
6	Safety. I want to thank all of my colleagues for
7	being here this morning as we vote on very important
8	pieces of legislation, and before I begin my remarks,
9	I certainly, on behalf of all New Yorker's, on behalf
10	of our speaker, Melissa Mark-Viverito, and certainly
11	all of the members of the Public Safety Committee, we
12	are heartbroken over the untimely passing of our
13	Brooklyn District Attorney, Ken Thompson who died
14	over the weekend. It is heartbreaking to know that
15	DA Ken Thompson is no longer with us, and I can
16	honestly say as Chair of this Committee for the past
17	three years, he has been an incredible part of this
18	Committee of the Public Safety world, a champion, a
19	reformer, someone who really looked at the criminal
20	justice system from a new lens, an innovator, someone
21	who dedicated his entire life to making a difference
22	for the people in this City and certainly in the
23	Borough of Brooklyn, and so he is a friend. Many of
24	us have known him over the course of his career, and
25	I certainly want to express my heartfelt and sincere

2	thoughts and prayers to his wife, to his son and his
3	daughter, to his parents, his brother and sister, all
4	of his family, friends, and all of his colleagues.
5	We will continue to mourn his loss, and certainly
6	knowing that in the spirit, his life, his legacy and
7	all of the work that he did as a champion for the
8	people will continue to last for generations to come.
9	So, on behalf of my colleagues, we want to express
10	our prayers to the Thompson family. May he rest in
11	eternal peace. Thank you colleagues. This morning
12	we will be voting on Proposed Intro 728B relating to
13	requiring the publication of the NYPD Patrol Guide
14	and to repeal Paragraph Two of Subdivision A of
15	Section 14-150 of the Administrative Code of the City
16	of New York relating to quarterly submission of the
17	NYPD Patrol Guide and Proposed Intro 959B relating to
18	requiring the Police Department to report on hate
19	crime statistics. I want to thank today's bill
20	sponsors, Council Member Dan Garodnick, for
21	sponsoring Intro 728B and Council Member Mark Levine
22	for sponsoring Proposed Intro 959B. Finally, I also
23	want to recognize the staff, our Committee Counsel,
24	Deepa Ambikar, Legislative Counsel, Beth Golub,
25	Financial Analyst, Ellen Ang, on my staff, Caitlyn

2	O'Hagan and Dana Wax. I want to thank the team for
3	working on these pieces of legislation. Very excited
4	about these bills on today's agenda. We heard
5	proposed Intro 728A just last month and proposed
6	Intro 959 in October of last year. Proposed Intro
7	728B continues on the Council's effort to promote
8	transparency within the NYPD. The Patrol Guide is
9	the NYPD's Operations Manual. It contains
10	comprehensive information about the rules that our
11	New York City police officers must follow in carrying
12	out their official duties. Currently, the public may
13	obtain portions of the Patrol Guide by submitting a
14	request under the Freedom of Information Law.
15	Several organizations have posted excerpts of the
16	Guide on their websites, and private entities sell
17	the Patrol Guide on line, but the NYPD does not
18	sanction and post their publication publicly. Intro
19	728B would require the Department to publicly post
20	the Patrol Guide and any updates within 24 hours of
21	the effective date. They would not be required to
22	post any sections that would reveal non-routine,
23	investigative techniques, confidential information or
24	anything that would compromise the safety of the
25	public or the police officers. Currently, the NYPD

2	reports on hate crimes annually, but the date is not
3	disaggregated by Animus [sic]. Proposed Intro 959B
4	will require the Department to quarterly and annually
5	report on hate crimes disaggregated by the motive
6	towards a targeted group such as race, nationality or
7	sexual orientation and on the demographics of the
8	arrestee. The Department would further be required
9	to disaggregate certain categories if a particular
10	group that is a target is targeted at least nine
11	times in a total of four consecutive quarters.
12	Finally, I'd like to thank all the members of the
13	Public Safety Committee who are here with us. The
14	safety of our city is of great importance and is
15	truly essential to the work that we collectively do
16	together on behalf of all of our communities, and
17	certainly these bills provide further information,
18	tools and resources that are available to all of us
19	to continue to make decisions on behalf of this city.
20	Both of these bills are a step in the right
21	direction, and I thank my colleagues, the prime
22	sponsors, support these measures and ask you to
23	please support them as well, and I ask you to support
24	these measures in addition to our prime sponsors.
25	We've been joined today by Minority Leader, Council
