## COMMITTEE ON HOUSING AND BUILDINGS

CHAIRPERSON WILLIAMS: Good afternoon everyone. My name is Jamanie Williams, Chair of the Council's Committee on Housing and Buildings.

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The city has recently experienced a series of gas explosions which recently, which resulted in fatalities, injury and displacement. In response we're introducing here a package of ten (10) bills designed to increase the safety of our gas infrastructure. We added these bills in April and have amended them to address concerns that have been voiced over the past few months.

Today we're here for the purposes of conducting a vote on this package of legislation. As mentioned, we took a lot of time with these bills.

Uh, there was some frustration but I think New

Yorker's should be proud at the time we took to make sure that we got the bills right and not just did something that was responsive but something that was helpful to solve the problem. We have a lot to cover so I'm gonna give a brief overview of the bill before us. Here we go.

Entry number 738A sponsored by Council Member Levine barring individuals from performing work on gas piping systems after January 1, 2020

unless such individuals are licensed master plumbers

holding a gas qualification or hold a limited gas

qualification to perform under the personnel and

5 immediate supervision of a gas qualification holder

6 or licensed master plumber.

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Proposal entry number 1079E sponsored by the Speaker would require that the final inspection of gas piping systems be performed by the Department of Buildings.

Proposed entry number 1088A sponsored by Council Member Espinal would require that commencing on January 1, 2019 owners of buildings with gas piping systems have such systems periodically inspected.

Proposed entry number 1090 sponsored by

Council Member Gibson will require owners to instruct

their tenants to call on one of their gas service

providers prior to informing such owners when a gas

leak is suspected.

Proposed entry number 1093A sponsored by Council Member Mendez would require gas service operators and building owners to notify the Department of Buildings within 24 hours when gas service is shut off or not restored.

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Proposed entry number 1094A sponsored by

Council Member Richards will require the

administration to identify set-up factors related to

natural gas violations that risk the safety of

residential and commercial buildings. The

administration would also be required to report on

how such risk factors have been used to target the

enforcement of laws and rules.

Proposed entry number 1098A sponsored by Council Member Rodriguez will require that gas corporation report to the administration annually on asset conditions, planned infrastructures, projects and investment priorities.

Proposed entry number 1100A sponsored by Council Member Vacca would require the Department of Buildings to establish or adopt a standard governing the installation and location of natural gas detectors after an industry standard has been promulgated. It would also require the installation of natural gas detectors that comply with standards in all multiple dwellings.

Entry number 1101 sponsored by myself would require the Department of Buildings to establish temporary field gas violations resolution

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program to allow owners of buildings with fuel gas
piping systems or appliances which violate any
provision of the New York City construction codes to
bring such systems or appliance into compliance with
such codes without penalties.

Entry number 1102 also sponsored by myself will designate violations of existing law regarding gas piping systems immediately hazardous.

Out of politeness we'll ask if any Council Members want to make any statements on the bills?

All right. Seeing none, I'd like to thank my staff for the work they did to assemble this hearing including Nick Smith, my deputy chief of staff and administrative director, Jen Wilcox and Megan Chen counsel to the Committee, Jim Mopitino [phonetic] and Hose Conde, policy analyst to the Committee and Sally Gassin [phonetic] the Committee's finance analyst. I'll be voting aye on this package of legislation and I encourage the Committee members to vote also in the affirmative. With that I'd like to call the clerk to call the roll.

5	adjusted by unscrupulous plumbers so I think it's
6	important that we continue to put laws in place so
7	they can be periodically inspected and make sure
8	those accidents don't continue to happen in the
9	future so with that I'll vote aye.
