Dickens of the subcommittee on planning dispositions and concessions and I welcome everyone to today's hearing and I want to thank and acknowledge my sergeant in arms, Allen Shoo. I first want to apologize to everyone for the lateness but this is the people's house that we serve in and our council members tried to negotiate to the best of their abilities what is needed in their respective districts and so there was an issue that was raised that had to be negotiated and I want to thank my colleagues for their patience and understanding and, and continuing to be available. I want to thank my land use director Raju Mann, deputy director Amy Levitan and my attorney Julie Lubin and Dillon Casey and I say both of them even though Dillon sticks it out with me all the time and project managers Jeff Ewin and Liz Lee. We are joined today by Council Members on the subcommittee Andy Cohen,

Darlene Mealy, Mark Treyger, and Ydanis Rodriguez, oh my god 100 percent attendance. Whoo, we giving out gold stars all day today. I want to thank you again and I want to thank the public and apologize to the public and to HPD for their, their patience in this and for habitat for agreeing to stay here to see this through and that shows a commitment on your behalf. We have six items on our calendar today. We are holding hearings on five of the applications before us because the sixth item was laid over from our last hearing. Today's hearings are on the following applications. For phase two through six of the small homes rehab NYCHA slash HFH land use items 535 through 539. I am now going to open up the public hearing for small homes rehab NYCHA slash HFH phase two through six land use items five through five through five through nine. These applications are located in Council Member Lancman, Miller, Richard, and Will's district in Queens and Council Member Darlene Mealy's district in Brooklyn. Each application is by HPD for approval of an urban development action area project and tax exemption. Approval of these actions would facilitate the

rehabilitation and sale of a 20 single family home

SUBCOMMITTEE ON PLANNING, DISPOSITIONS AND 1 CONCESSIONS 6 currently owned by NYCHA and these homes would be 2 3 available for sale and affordable to families making 4 between 50 and 80 percent of the area median income. I'm going to ask Arti [sp?] Pearson, director of land use at HPD to come up. Nadja Ratcliffe, director of 6 7 small homes rehab programs at HPD, Christopher Illum, Habitat for Humanity New York City and you're going 8 to give testimony on all of the five items. Alright, please identify yourselves; turn on your mics, thank 10 11 you. I'm Arti Pearson, director 12 ARTI PEARSON: 13 of land use [inaudible 4:17] governmental relations. NADJA RATCLIFFE: Hi, Nadja Ratcliffe, 14 15 director for homeownership programs at HPD. 16 CHRISTOPHER ILLUM: Christopher Ilum vice 17 president of home ownership and family services at 18 Habitat for Humanity New York City. 19 ARTI PEARSON: Land use numbers 535, 536, 20 537, 538, and 539 consist of a, a total of 20 small 21 homes slated for redevelopment under HPD small homes 2.2 and rehab NYCHA programs. Land use number 535 is 2.3 located in council district 24 and consists of one home. Land use number 536 is located in council 24

district 27 and consists of seven homes. Land use

number 537 is located in council district 28 and 2 3 consists of four homes. Land use number 538 is located in council district 31 and consists of five 4 homes and land use number 539 is located council district 41 and consists of three homes. Each home 6 7 was foreclosed upon more than 20 years ago as a 8 result of FHA mortgage default and they were turned over to NYCHA to operate as part of their public housing portfolio by HUD. Over time the homes became 10 11 vacant and are currently in dire need of 12 rehabilitation. NYCHA with approval from HUD selected 13 Habitat for Humanity as the sponsor to convey the 14 properties to and each will undergo gut 15 rehabilitation through the small homes rehab NYCHA 16 program which is a home ownership program for one to 17 family homes affordable to families earning up to 80 18 percent of AMI as per HUD guidelines. This group of 19 buildings is a second closing for habitat with the 20 program. Of the 20 homes, 17 are located within 21 Queens, council districts 24, 27, 28, and 31 and 2.2 three are in Brooklyn council district 41. Once the 2.3 homes have completed rehabilitation the properties will be conveyed to low to moderate income families 24 25 earning between 50 and 80 percent of AMI with sales

COUNCIL MEMBER MEALY: That please, thank you.

CHRISTOPHER ILLUM: I would be happy to. And, and thank you so much for, for your words. So Habitat for Humanity in New York City mandates at minimum always the first time home buyer program for a single family homeowners versus normally we do multi-family but for single family homeowners they'll also go through credibility workshops focusing on personal finance, the importance of maintaining good credit, proper credit, appropriate credit for not only the time in which they are qualifying for the home they're going through underwriting but on... well into the future. Habitat for Humanity in New York City also provides training on home maintenance so that way they're... the families who are purchasing this know how to care for their home to maintain the home but also to make any minor improvements they may choose to do so without having to always go out and you know hire a contractor to do so.

COUNCIL MEMBER MEALY: Can I just ask one... and I know we've been here long enough. Home maintenance is different when it's multiple homes; this is a one family single...

[cross-talk] COUNCIL MEMBER MEALY: Maintenance... 6 7 [cross-talk] CHRISTOPHER ILLUM: Have a different... we... 8 9 yes, that's exactly right. So the home maintenance training that we will do is based solely on the, the 10 11 systems that are in each individual home so they'll be trained about their boiler, they'll be trained 12 13 about proper caring for their gutters, leaders... that ... 14 those are major problems that can happen for single 15 family homes. So we have a team in place as well as we often work with community based organizations to 16 17 get such training. 18 COUNCIL MEMBER MEALY: Thank you, just 19 want to say thank you madam Chair for being so 20 patient that's why you the queen. 21 CHAIRPERSON DICKENS: Thank you. Thank you so much council member. I too, I want to enter to 2.2 2.3 the record the letter from Habitat from Humanity which spells out what the purchase... the approximate 24

projected sales price of the homes would be and the
