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3 CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: Good morning.

My name is David Greenfield, I'm the Council Member from the 44 of council district in Brooklyn and I'm privileged to serve as the chair of the Land Use Committee. I want to welcome my esteemed colleagues who are members of the committee who have joined us today. Council Member Gentile, Council Member Palma, Council Member Dickens, Council Member Garodnick, Council Member Rodriguez, Council Member Koo, Council Member Lander, Council Member Rose, Council Member Williams, Council Member Richards, Council Member Barron, Council Member Cohen, Council Member Kallos, Council Member Treyger. I want to thank Chair Dickens for her dedication and leadership on the Planning Subcommittee, Chair Richards for conducting the Zoning Subcommittee and Chair Koo for his work on the Landmarks Subcommittee. I especially want to recognize Chair Inez Dickens for her leadership; she has spent the last decade, that's ten years for those of you who

can only serve eight years.

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2 CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: ...here in the 3 New York City Council...

Of course represents wonderful areas such as

Harlem, she is incredibly smart, fair, and funny
and she's one of the great leaders that we have
here in this body. Our loss is Albany's gain and we
are truly sad to see you go but we thank you for
your many years of hard work and dedication not
just on the Planning Subcommittee but for all the
great work that you've done on the budget
negotiations in leadership and really the fabulous
work that you've done here in the City Council over
the last ten years and we wish you much and
continued success as this being your last Land Use
Committee meeting. Let's give the Chair a big round
of applause please...

CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: We'll give the chair opportunity to make remarks at the end if she'd like. I'm also very excited to report to you that we will be voting today on a piece of legislation that marks an important milestone of

the council's commitment in accountability in land
use and that will be the second vote that we are
doing today. We are also voting to disapprove a
small rezoning in Council Member Lander's district.
The Council's voting no on LU531 and 532, an
application for rezoning from a M11 to an R6B in
designation for a mandatory inclusionary housing
area on three lots in Council Member Brad Lander's
district in Brooklyn. The site of the rezoning is
located on the border of both predominately
manufacturing and residential uses. Anytime the
city considers whether to rezone manufacturing land
we must carefully consider whether the public
benefit of the new uses would outweigh the
potential loss in jobs and economic activity that
is associated with manufacturing and development.
In this case the rezoning would lead to a
development of exclusively market rate housing, we
are willing to disapprove the application because
the commercial and manufacturing use is currently
permitted on the property would in our view better
serve the city and the neighborhood than the
anticipated development that would result from the

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2 rezoning. Are there any questions or remarks on 3 this application? Council Member Lander.

COUNCIL MEMBER LANDER: Thank you Mr. Chair and thanks for you dialogue with me and leadership on this issue. I said this in subcommittee and most of you were here so I'll try to keep it brief but it's unusual to be moving to disapprove so for members who weren't I'll just quickly restate. I am asking you to vote yes to disapprove this application which I don't take any relish in doing but in this case there's just not a, a public intersect in rezoning the land. We have a 6200 square foot lot currently zoned manufacturing in a mixed area with some mix of residential and manufacturing on the block. There are good light manufacturing and commercial uses nearby that the community needs and relies on but which have been being displaced in this area because of rising rent and speculation over the last few years and so we could use the M-zoned... the uses that are allowable on this site today. Now had they brought a rezoning that would include at least the MIH standard of affordability there would be public benefit to rezone it to residential but even

2	though the applicant is seeking a rezoning that
3	would take it above the minimum MIH threshold, up
4	to 13,700 square feet of developable residential
5	space, they have made clear they do not intend to
6	utilize or participate in the MIH program and that
7	they would build zero affordable housing and not
8	participate in the in-lieu fee program and so
9	there's just no public interest or, or public
10	rational for this rezoning. We sought different
11	ways of working with them so that they would
12	utilize the MIH program either just by doing it
13	under what they're seeking today and committing to
14	do it or even adding some additional density to the
15	site or making it mixed use. Those latter two
16	things however out of scope of the application that
17	they submitted and they refused to, to indicate
18	that they would utilize or commit to utilize the,
19	the MIH program. So at that point I just don't see
20	any public benefit in this rezoning. Perhaps they
21	will resubmit a new application that does have the
22	benefit of participating in MIH and we can take it
23	up again then but both because it doesn't make
24	sense on this site and because I think it's very
25	important for this council to be standing up for at

3	me in voting to disapprove this application so
4	thank you very much.

8	hearing none we'll move onto a vote. Just to be
9	clear this is the first of two votes today so
10	please stick around. We'll now call the vote to
11	disapprove Land Use items 531 and 532 in accordance
12	of the recommendation of the zoning subcommittee
13	and Council Member Lander. I'm going to ask the
14	clerk to please call the roll just to be clear a
15	yes vote means you agree with the Zoning
16	Subcommittee's recommendations to disapprove this
17	application.

24	I have in Land Use over the years to help this body

16	way street and there must be a direct public
17	benefit. So I commend you for your courage for
18	standing up to people on behalf of your district
19	and the city of New York and to my colleague who's
20	also the Chair of our subcommittee thank you for
21	your wisdom, for your… you know I was… I was a
22	rookie and I learned a lot from you. You held
23	developers accountable, you've held HPD
24	accountable, you've held anyone who comes on that

on that hearing accountable and we've learned so

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much from you. I look forward to visiting you in Harlem, trying some good food out there and this, this will always be your home here too. God bless you and I vote age on all.

COMMUNITY CLERK DESTEFANO: By a vote of 18 in the affirmative, zero in the negative, and no abstentions the LU items have been disapproved.

well this concludes the first part of our hearing but we're going to move onto part number two. We have another piece of legislation that we are going to be voting on today. We're going to be voting on intro 1132A which is a bill that would require the administration to establish and maintain a publically accessible searchable database of written commendments made by the mayor to the city council or a council member in a connection with the most... with most eulipe applications. This legislation was introduced by the Public Advocate and the speaker as a much needed reform to help improve the public dialogue and trust during the public review process for Neighborhood

2	Rezonings and this reform was part of the
3	commitment that we and the council secured from the
4	Deputy Mayor during the council's negotiation and
5	subsequent approval of the mandatory inclusionary
6	housing programs in February. We had a hearing on
7	this legislation last June and we have carefully
8	considered all the testimony in working out a set
9	of changes to this legislation. We worked
10	extensively with administration to reach a final
11	bill that would require transparency and
12	accountability in the rezoning process while still
13	being manageable for the administration to maintain
14	and update. The final legislation will track all
15	commitments made by the mayor to the council
16	relating to eulipe applications for changes in the
17	city map, designations of zoning districts under
18	the zoning resolution including conversion from
19	land use to another land use, special permits
20	within the jurisdiction of the city planning
21	commission under the zoning resolution. Site
22	selection for capital projects for evocable
23	consents, franchises and major concessions, housing
24	and urban renewal plans, and projects pursuant to
25	city, state, and federal housing laws. The position
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2	of real property of the city or acquisition by the
3	city of real property. In all cases the legislation
4	would require tracking of commitments for
5	applications involving properties on city blocks. I
6	strongly believe this would be a powerful tool to
7	ensure that the commitments that we as council
8	members achieve on behalf of our communities will
9	be under similar communities and administrations
10	such as this one and the next one and all future
11	administrations will be held accountable to these
12	critical commitments. I'd like to thank the
13	speaker, Melissa Mark-Viverito for her leadership
14	and her showing you to keep track of promises made
15	to our community during the zoning process. I just
16	want to thank Public Advocate Latisha James for her
17	leadership as well and Council Member Elpinal for
18	his advocacy on this important piece of
19	legislation. Council Member Espinal knows just how
20	important keeping these commitments are with his
21	recent neighborhood rezoning in east New York where
22	the city pledged to invest over a quarter of a
23	billion dollars in community benefits including
24	funding to improving parks, schools, and the east
25	New York IBZ. The east New York rezoning in Council

2	Member Espinal's district will be the first
3	application subject to this legislation and all
4	commitments made within that rezoning will now be
5	tracked. As we look to upcoming neighborhood
6	rezonings I am confident this legislation will
7	provide significant transparency and accountability
8	to the process. This bill's been a subject of much
9	spirited discussions since its introduction and I
10	want to thank all the advocates for their input. I
11	especially want to thank Adam Freeman the director
12	of the Pratt Center for his support and
13	collaboration. I also want to thank our outstanding
14	Land Use staff who worked on this bill for nearly
15	ten months, our Land Use Director Raju Mann, Deputy
16	Director Amy Levitan, General Council Julie Lubin,
17	Deputy General Council Dillon Casey, and Council
18	Jeff Compania [phonetic] and I also want to thank
19	of course everyone's favorite staff Ramon Martinez
20	for negotiating this legislation successfully with
21	the administration. This really is very significant
22	legislation that for the first time for the first
23	time we will now track promises made by the
24	administration to communities and the reason it's
25	so fundamental is because if you don't know what
