2 CHAIRPERSON TORRES: The hearing is 3 coming to order. Good afternoon everyone. I am City 4 Council Member Richie Torres and I chair the 5 Committee on Public Housing. And I'm proud to be 6 joined by the majority leader; Council Member Jimmy 7 Van Bramer, Council Member Rafael Salamanca from the 8 Bronx, Council Member Rosie Mendez. And we are here 9 for the purposes of conducting a vote on two bills, 10 yes bills. These two bills will potentially, 11 depending on how this vote goes and how the vote at 12 tomorrow's stated meeting goes be the first two bills 13 out of the Public Housing Committee to be enacted 14 into law ever. As I previously mentioned at the 15 hearing on these bills back in June the city's vision for improving public housing must extend beyond brick 16 17 and mortar. A truly comprehensive plan for not merely 18 preserving but transforming public housing means a 19 commitment to creating economic opportunity for 20 public housing residents. NYCHA is more than a 21 landlord; it is a city unto itself, home to 400,000 2.2 residents many of whom face deeply engrained barriers 23 to educational attainment and employment. The 24 question, the question of how to best break down such 25 barriers lies at the heart of these bills. Countless

2 public residents access city services and programs 3 designed to give families and individuals a fighting 4 chance at a better life yet we have very little information about the effectiveness of those services 5 and programs. These bills seek to make that 6 7 information public so that the city can better serve and support the residents of public housing. Proposed 8 9 intro number 1213A would require the mayor or an agency designated by the mayor to publish an annual 10 11 report on the outcomes of services provided to public 12 housing residents including employment related services, financial counseling or banking services, 13 14 income support services, adult education services, 15 and business related services. Propose intro number 16 1214A would require the city's center for economic 17 opportunity to review the jobs plus program which is 18 a national program designed to increase the earnings 19 and levels of employment of public housing residents 20 and make recommendations for its expansion. I'm proud to sponsor both of these bills and encourage this 21 committee to vote in the affirmative. With that said 2.2 23 I ask the clerk to please call the roll.

MATTHEW DESTEFANO: Continuation of Roll 18 19 Call; Council Member Cumbo. 20 COUNCIL MEMBER CUMBO: Thank you, 21 permission to explain my vote? 2.2 CHAIRPERSON TORRES: Of course. 23 COUNCIL MEMBER CUMBO: I want to thank Council Member Torres for his leadership and for also 24 holding the vote open. I proudly support intro number 25

1213A and I believe that this annual report 2 3 documenting beginning in 2017 on the outcomes of services provided to public housing residents will 4 5 have a huge impact in terms of everything from employment to financial counseling and many other 6 7 aspects. I'm also in support of proposed intro 1214A in terms of requiring the city center for economic 8 9 opportunity to review the jobs plus program. We heard 10 some incredible testimony in the hearings that was 11 very informative and I am very proud to support both 12 pieces of legislation and I proudly vote aye. MATTHEW DESTEFANO: The vote now stands 13

14 at five in the affirmative, zero in the negative, and 15 no abstentions.

16 CHAIRPERSON TORRES: Thank you for those 17 kind words Council Member Cumbo. So with that said 18 the meeting... the hearing is adjourned.
