3	CHAIRPERSON GIBSON: Good morning, ladies
4	and gentlemen. Good morning, colleagues. I am
5	Council Member Vanessa Gibson of the 16 <sup>th</sup> District of
6	the Bronx, and I'm proud to serve as Chair of the
7	Committee on Public Safety. I welcome all of you
8	here this morning for today's Committee vote on a
9	very important piece of legislation. Today we are
LO	voting on Proposed Intro 1147A relating to
L1	establishing an Office of Crime Victim Services. I
L2	am proud to be a co-sponsor of this legislation and
L3	want to recognize our prime and lead sponsor Council
L 4	Member Laurie Cumbo and our Speaker Melissa Mark-
L5	Viverito, and I want to thank all of the fellow co-
L 6	sponsors who've joined on this bill. I'd also like
L7	to say that we are very excited about this bill
L8	because earlier this year during the speaker's State
L 9	of the City speech she outlined a very robust
20	Criminal Justice agenda that included the creation of
21	the Office of Crime Victim Services. While there are
22	several offices currently that serve crime victims
23	through various agencies such as the NYPD, the

Mayor's Office to Combat Domestic violence and other

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not-for-profit agencies. There is not one centralized location that a victim can turn to.

This new office will coordinate the service providers including City agencies to insure that crime victims are being served. These providers will include organizations that provide social services to crime victims such as emergency and transitional shelter, language services and trauma services. addition, the Office will publish an annual update of a directory of all service providers in the City by the type, the location of services, the hours of operation and services that are provided. Finally, this Office would prepare an annual report that would include a needs assessment of where there should be an increased coordination for victims of crime. Through this legislation, we will continue to support our communities with all the tools that are available I thank all of my colleagues for being here and just certainly want to say that I applaud the efforts of our Speaker and Council Member Cumbo. Several months ago we heard this Bill on our agenda and we had a lot of support from an array of service providers such as Safe Horizon and, you know, the

3	for Families, many of our providers that serve
4	victims of domestic violence, but we recognize that
5	there are many New Yorkers that are victims of crime
6	sadly every day, and we want to make sure that
7	there's a coordinated and an integrated effort that
8	provides an array of services. Many of us work with
9	families that are impacted by gun violence and we
10	know that families, parents, siblings are all
11	affected deeply by the endless cycle of gun violence,
12	and so when you look at victim services, it is
13	obviously emergency housing, social and human
14	services, access to health care, and especially for
15	me, making sure that their public safety is
16	maintained. So, I thank all of my colleagues for
17	their support of this Bill and I encourage all of you
18	to vote in favor of this legislation on our agenda
19	today. I'd also like to recognize and thank the
20	staff for putting this hearing, this vote together,
21	our Committee Counsel, Deepa Ambikar, Legislative
22	Counsel, Beth Golub [sp?], our Policy Analyst, Casey
23	Addison, and our Financial Analyst, Steve Riester
24	[sp?], and I also want to thank our Finance Director,
25	Latonya McKinney. I'd also like to recognize that

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we've been joined by our Minority Leader, Council
Member Steve Matteo, Council Member Vincent Gentile,

James Vacca, Robert Cornegy, Chaim Deutsch, Rafael

Espinal, and we also have one of our sponsors, the

prime sponsor that introduced Intro 1147A, and I'd

like to ask her to say a few words in support of this

legislation, Council Member Laurie Cumbo.

COUNCIL MEMBER CUMBO: Thank you Chair Today is certainly "her"storical [sic] and I Gibson. want to thank all of my colleagues for being there. I want to thank the Public Safety Committee for all of their work in making today possible. This is a really very important piece of legislation, because we recognize that while there are several City agencies and not-for-profits that provide service, there is no centralized point of contact where a victim can go to be connected with the various services available in the City. Today, that will change, and as we've seen while so many forms of crime are down in New York City, unfortunately crime as it pertains to issues around sexual assault, attacks against women have continued to escalate and rise in the City of New York. We have to continue to do all that we can and to work with all the mayoral

2	agencies to make sure that we end violence against
3	women, that we make sure that we provide proper and
4	appropriate services should a crime happen and as
5	well as we've seen in the Presidential election,
6	there has been a normalizing of sexual assault and
7	crime against women. It's so important that we
8	continue to raise and amplify our voices whenever we
9	have an opportunity to do so to end the cycle of
10	crime that continues to impact women. So this is an
11	important piece of legislation. I want to thank
12	Speaker Melissa Mark-Viverito, who in her State of
13	the City spoke very passionately about the creation
14	of this office and collectively together along with
15	Chair Gibson and the entire members of the Public
16	Safety Committee as well as the Women's Issues
17	Committee have worked very hard to bring this piece
18	of legislation to fruition. We hope that it will
19	impact and it will help so many that have become
20	victims to actually utilize that experience to become
21	survivors and also to help so many. Thank you again,
22	Chair Gibson, for all of your support and I'll now
23	turn it back to her.
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CHAIRPERSON GIBSON: Thank you very much
Council Member Cumbo, and thank you for your

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set up the types of services that you're proposing

now come together in an Office of Victims Services, and while I was more than willing to do so, I always

thought there should be some coordination for those services. That's what this bill does, and so I thank

6 you for it, and I proudly, proudly vote age on it.

WILLIAM MARTIN: Vacca?

COUNCIL MEMBER VACCA: Like to explain my vote.

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CHAIRPERSON GIBSON: Yes.

COUNCIL MEMBER VACCA: I would like first to be added as a co-sponsor of the bill. it's fantastic. When I was a district manager of a Community Board and now as a Councilperson, I can't begin to tell you how many times people who are victims of crime come to my office and they don't know where to go, and they don't know what services are available, and many times these are senior citizens who are the victims of scams. Many times these are people who are attacked on a bus. gambit of crime victims in our City and the fact that they have not had a voice for so long makes this legislation essential. Hopefully, this will serve as a central clearing house for information and coordination, because we have a lot of people out

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CHAIRPERSON GIBSON: Thank you very much, and thank you colleagues. Thank you Council Member Cumbo, and thank you to our speaker. We're going to keep the roll open to allow other members of the Committee to join us, and I will also just add as we close that in your Committee report, just so my colleagues are aware, the NYPD is launching a threeyear program to create a crime victim advocate program in each of our police precincts, and I'm very proud to say that the contract was awarded to Safe Horizon, and they're going to have staff in every precinct throughout the City, all 77 precincts and PSA's to provide an array of services working in conjunction with the NYPD. So thank you, Safe Horizon, and thank you to all of my colleagues who have joined us today. Thank you.

COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS: I vote aye.
