Representatives from the Mayor's Office of Management and Budget are here to answer any questions on the modifications.

Next the Committee will be voting on a transparency resolution that sets for a new designation and changes in the designation of certain organizations receiving local aging and youth discretionary funding, and funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the budget.

Organizations appearing with the resolution that have not yet completed the prequalification process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services, the Council or any other entity are identified in the attached with an asterisk (*).

As with all transparency resolutions, Council Members will have to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any of the groups on the attached list. If any Council Member has a potential conflict of interest with any

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of the organizations listed, he or she has the opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of their vote.

As a reminder, please disclose any conflicts you may have with such proposed subcontractors that are used by organizations sponsored by discretionary funding. disclosures must be made before the subcontractor can be approved. Rohan Grant from the General Counsel's Office is here and can assist you with any questions or concerns regarding the disclosure.

The Committee will also be voting on a land use item concerning the Notre Dame Apartments project in Council Member Torres' district. Notre Dame Apartments is a 98-unit building constructed for elderly and handicapped individuals, originally developed under HUD Section 202 Housing Loan Program. The owner is now seeking to refinance this loan in order to decrease debt service and rehab the property and is seeking an Article 11 tax exemption in order to maintain affordability of the low-income housing. Council Member Torres supports these proposed changes.

Finally, the Committee will be voting on
the Council's FY18 Operating Budget. The Council has
until March 16th to submit to the Mayor its own
operating budget for the next fiscal year. This
budget must be presented to the Mayor for inclusion
in the Executive Budget without amendment from the
Mayor after the Council approves it. For FY18, the
Council's proposed Operating Budget totals just over
\$64 million, with approximately \$49.2 million in
personnel services costs and \$14.8 million other than
personnel services costs. The proposed FY18 budget
represents no increase over the Council's FY17
budget. The Council's Fiscal Officer, Marcello
Testa, is here to answer any questions on the
Council's budget and he's very eager to get questions
that's what he said.
