3 CHAIRPERSON EUGENE: Good morning. Ι'm 4 Council Member Mathieu Eugene, and I'm the Chair of 5 the Youth Services Committee. Thank you for making 6 the time to come and vote on this important piece of legislation concerning disconnected youth. 8 really is a continuation of our effort to improve the 9 quality of services available to the disconnected 10 youth in our city, and our quest to end the 11 disconnected youth-youth crisis in New York City. 12 you may recall, in their program, the City Council 13 voted another bill that I introduced. It was 708-A, 14 which will created a disconnected youth taskforce. 15 Both bills got their start last year when we had a 16 hearing on disconnected youth where the Administration testified on what it was doing to help 17 18 this population. Advocates are also testifying to 19 the wide range of services they offer the 20 disconnected youth and recommended ways in which the 21 city can improve service delivery to disconnected youth, and have their achieve their full potential. 2.2 23 At the last census in 2010, there were approximately 24 170,000 disconnected youth. I would not be surprised 25 if that number has increased today. But despite its

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existence of both public and private programming serving disconnected youth, there hearing reveal that those programs are not enough to meet the demand of disconnected youth. Additionally, advocates were quick to put out that some of the programs already in existence were not adequately meeting the specific needs of disconnected youth. It was clear from the hearing that we have enough work to do to better move to the need of the city's-city's disconnected youth population. This bill takes us in that direction. Beyond their testimony, many advocates are enlightened (sic) that the Department of Small Businesses Disconnected Youth Job Program was not comprehensive enough to meet the demand of the disconnected youth. Other concerns are enlightened that having a disconnected youth program in SBS was a duplication of services because of SBS already provides job placement services through its Workforce Center, which are designed to serve adults and are better suited to serve adults who are there in the workforce. In fact, many advocates express their preference for DYCD's Disconnected Youth Program, which they have stressed has served disconnected youth well. While I appreciated the concern and

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recommendation, I am enlightened by the advocates. also realized that the importance of ensuring that if SBS was going to serve disconnected youth, it was important to ensure that services that are provided were adequate to meet the need of this vulnerable population. As a result, we took into consideration the concern of the advocates and modified the legislation to reflect those concerns. The legislation now requires, as we see, SBS to provide services such as referring disconnected youth to agencies or community-based organizations that will help them deal with issues such as mental health, child care, Criminal Justice issues or trans-or transportation. Additionally, the legislation requires SBS to give up and implement education and job training programs included as part of their skill training to provide follow-up services and information on needed-needed or receive education. It is important to note that the DYCD, the Department of Education, the Human Resources Administration, and the Mayor's Office will be involved in the implementation of this program. I am excited that this bill ensure that LDS (sic) Disconnected Youth Program will provide targeted services that will

We've heard numerous testimony about our disconnected youth, and what happens to that population between the ages of 16 and 24, and what I really appreciate about this legislation is that it's not just simply finding them something to do, but it's also about ensuring that they're going to have the educational opportunities to continue their education and job training so that they can actually create a career path. And I think that this is really important because we know that many young people between the ages of 16 and 24 if they don't receive that proper involvement, if they don't receive proper training, if they don't have the opportunity to continue their education, that many of them will be stuck in the situations that they are in

3	legislation. I'm proud to support it. I, too, would
4	also like to be added to the bill, and I congratulate
5	you, and I proudly vote aye.
