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On June 4th I was thrilled to attend the Queens Pride Parade and see students from our public schools proudly marching with teachers, their parents and other staff members who were wearing their OUT for Safe Schools badges. The DOE tonight, in fact, is holding their second annual Pride Celebration at Tweed at 5:30.

Although we have made strides in embracing diversity and recognizing individuals for who they are, there is more that can be done; that is why I'm so proud that our committee will be voting on Proposed Resolution 1415-A today.

Our educational practices should reinforce that in our city all identities are valued and members of every group make remarkable contributions to our society. Proposed Resolution 1415-A calls on the State to create a task force to review state learning standards and whether they are culturally relevant, challenge racism, ableism, and sexism and affirm LGBTQ and transgender nonconforming perspectives.

As the Speaker discussed in her State of the City Address in February, in the current climate in our country our students need the critical thinking skills necessary to challenge racism, sexism and other forms of discrimination; an important step in that effort is ensuring that the content we teach in our schools fosters critical thinking and reflects the diversity of our students.

We also must ensure that students and families are informed about the many opportunities available to them in our school system, including gifted and talented programs. Proposed Intro 1347-A would require the Department of Education to distribute information on gifted and talented programs to the parents of every pre-kindergarten student. This bill would require outreach to families so that they are aware of G&T options and the exam and application process. It is imperative that we communicate clearly with our students and their families so that they can take full advantage of the options provided by our public school system.
