3	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Good morning, I
4	haven't done that in a long time. So, good morning.
5	Council Member Johnson, the Chair of this committee
6	is on his way, he's been detained but I've been asked
7	as the Senior Member to Chair this meeting… hearing
8	until he gets here. Today we are going to be
9	listening to testimony and voting on a pre-considered
10	Intro Number no number and this Intro what it does
11	is amend Intro 1233, which we passed last month and
12	all it is doing is extending the time when the
13	legislation takes effect. The legislation in 1233,
14	which is the legislation to ban the use of some
15	exotic animals in traveling circuses would take in
16	180 days after the bill is signed by the Mayor. In
17	order to, on the request of one of the circuses,
18	UniverSoul Circus who I had been talking to, we've
19	been asked to extend the time for them to be able to
20	phase out animals. They will also have testimony
21	today, which will elaborate more on that. So, at this
22	point let me just say whose here today. We are joined
23	by Council Member Eugene from Brooklyn, Council
24	Member Barron and the Co-Sponsor of this bill from
25	Brooklyn, Council Member Cornegy and a Co-Sponsor of
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2 this bill from Brooklyn, and Council Member Jimmie 3 Vacca from the Bronx. Having said that I will now 4 call up Benjamin Thomas... Benjamin Johnson from 5 UniverSoul Circus.

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BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Good morning, is that ... 6 7 okay. So, in his absence I'd like to thank Chairman Johnson but I'd certainly like to thank the Sponsor ... 8 9 the Sponsor of the bill Rosie Mendez for allowing me to come before you this morning to testify. On the 10 11 extender to bill 1233A. As she mentioned my name is Ben Johnson, I'm the Director of Operations for Soul 12 13 Circus Incorporated, which owns UniverSoul Circus and 14 is an Atlanta based company. I'm here on behalf of 15 generations of New Yorkers who have enjoyed the 16 circus. While we philosophically disagree about the 17 role of animals in circuses we respect the Council's 18 decision in passing Intro 1233A. Our many New York 19 supporters are families, ranging from children to 20 senior citizens and every age in between, who 21 represent the true diversity and spirit of New York. 2.2 Though they are not as vocal as the proponents of the 23 bill, our tens of thousands of annual attendees speak with their ongoing support of UniverSoul Circus. As 24 elected officials who represent our fan base, you can 25

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give voice to them by extending the implementation 2 3 date of bill number 1233A to December 31, 2020. After 4 considerable discussions amongst the leadership of 5 UniverSoul Circus we have a strong desire to continue our commitment to the many communities in New York 6 7 City that UniverSoul has amazed and entertained for nearly a guarter century. In 2018 UniverSoul will 8 celebrate its 25th anniversary, so with this long 9 history of performing, UniverSoul Circus will need to 10 review how it will reinvent itself based on what the 11 12 bill requires and whether or not that new rendition 13 would be viable for New York City. For a national 14 company of UniverSoul's scale, the reconfiguration 15 needed based on 1233A will require extensive 16 restructuring with vendors and performers to evaluate and assess the best path forward. Additionally, 17 18 UniverSoul Circus will need to produce an entirely 19 different show in order to comply with 1233A, which 20 you can imagine is no small feat. New York City is an 21 integral part in our 10-month 16 city tour schedule. So, to have a chance at a successful transition, we 2.2 23 need a three-year period to adjust our business model. UniverSoul Circus annually contributes more 24 than 2.5 million dollars to the New York City economy 25

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and supports hundreds of jobs here during the two and 2 3 half months of our ten-month tour that we perform in this market. We also support a wide array of 4 charities and organizations that focus on youth, 5 seniors and underprivileged members of the community. 6 7 One example of our outreach from this year's engagement was adding a special performance in Queens 8 9 to host 2,100 plus clients of the Samaritan Daytop Village, which is a shelter for homeless families, 10 11 they were uplifted by the free, exclusive show for them and their interaction with our circus 12 13 performers. They were not only entertained but were 14 also provided complimentary food and novelties to 15 enhance their experience. UniverSoul will continue to 16 follow the longstanding regulations of the USDA, New York State, and New York City, and certainly the 17 18 guidelines of the New York City Health and Mental 19 Hygiene Department which has led the nation in animal 20 protection. While we disagree with those who support banning exotic animals from performing in the city, 21 we understand and respect the sincerity of those who 2.2 23 share that view. Indeed, the ability to disagree on matters of public importance and to work toward 24 finding a reasonable middle ground is part of what 25

2	makes this country the great nation it is. Circuses
3	around the world have always inspired the positive,
4	progressive movement of mankind. They are and always
5	will be a reflection of our humanity, strength,
6	commonality, and resilience. So, thank you again and
7	we strongly urge the council to extend the
8	implementation of 1233A to December 2020 so we can
9	achieve these valuable goals. Thank you Council
10	Member Mendez.
11	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Thank you very
12	much. I'm just going to have a few questions [cross-
13	talk]
14	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Yes, ma'am [cross-
15	talk]
16	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ:but first I'm
17	going to let you know that we cannot amend this bill
18	at this moment to change the date, under the rules of
19	the city council the current bill's age and that's
20	the bill we're voting on… [cross-talk]
21	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Okay [cross-talk]
22	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ:so there, there
23	would have to be a new bill in the future… [cross-
24	talk]

5	that again would amend this amendment to [cross-
6	talk]
7	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Yes… [cross-talk]
8	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ:the bill.
9	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Yes, ma'am.
10	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Okay. I know my
11	colleagues have to run but I do have a question
12	because we've been talking Mr. Johnson and I
13	understand the importance of getting through the 25^{th}
14	anniversary, certainly if you've had a business model
15	for 24 years I don't know that you can switch it in
16	what the bill calls for now, 180 days… [cross-talk]
17	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Uh-huh [cross-talk]
18	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: The amendment
19	will give you more than a year, it would take us to
20	October 1 st , of 2018… [cross-talk]
21	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Uh-huh [cross-talk]
22	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Yesterday or the
23	day before yesterday when we were talking I
24	understood you were looking to extend to December 20

2	31 st , 2019 and now I see in your testimony you're
3	saying 2020.
4	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: So, I, I think that's
5	where the confusion is on the language that's in the
6	extension… [cross-talk]
7	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Uh-huh [cross-
8	talk]
9	BENJAMIN JOHNSON:so the extension
10	reads 180 days after and it has a date next to it,
11	which was October of 2018 [cross-talk]
12	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Do you [cross-
13	talk]
14	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: So… [cross-talk]
15	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Do and so let me
16	just… because when I read it I got confused, the
17	original bill says 180 days… [cross-talk]
18	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Uh-huh [cross-talk]
19	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ:and then that
20	was struck through and we're putting in October $1^{ m st}$
21	so, we're changing 180 days with a date turn which is
22	October 1 st [cross-talk]
23	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: I see what you're
24	saying… [cross-talk]

2	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ:but the bill has
3	what was there, what's being amended and struck out
4	which is 180 days and then the new date which is
5	being inserted in and that's what this amendment
6	would be.
7	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Okay, so there was a
8	misinterpretation of what that was, it, it, it the
9	way it read to us was 180 days after that date which
10	would have taken it to March 30 th , 2019 so… [cross-
11	talk]
12	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: I will just look
13	to the council and make sure that my reading of it
14	was correct, I am being told yes. The brackets mean
15	deletion, okay?
16	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Okay, I, I apologize,
17	we, we were… we were unaware of, of… [cross-talk]
18	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Okay [cross-
19	talk]
20	BENJAMIN JOHNSON:what the intention of
21	the brackets were, okay.
22	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Okay [cross-
23	talk]
24	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: So, so what, what we
25	were discussing when I indicated December 31 st , 2019

2	was if we understood it, it had another 180 days that
3	would have gotten us into June of 2020. Annually we
4	come to New York between March… late March and May so
5	if we were able to go into June of 2020 then that
6	would have given us the three seasons that we're
7	asking for. So, that would be next year, 2019 and
8	then 2020.
9	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: I, I understand
10	now [cross-talk]
11	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Yes, ma'am.
12	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Okay, just to
13	check clarity for other people who've not been in our
14	discussions and just… [cross-talk]
15	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Yes, ma'am [cross-
16	talk]
17	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ:to I think be as
18	transparent, we're voting on this bill today, I do
19	want to hear back from UniverSoul Circus, I am also
20	asking which wouldn't be until September if
21	UniverSoul could come to the Black Latino Asian
22	Caucus and my discussion with you Mr. Johnson is if
23	we are going to do another amendment down the road I
24	want to understand what animals are being phased out
25	at what point… [cross-talk]

3	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ:and how that
4	would affect your business model and, and but
5	clearly knowing which animals that you currently use
6	that are subject to the ban when they would be phased
7	out from your tours here in New York.
8	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Okay
9	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Okay. Colleagues
10	do you have any questions colleagues? No, okay. So,
11	I'm going to call the vote. I am recommending a yes
12	vote in the absence of the Chair. Billy Martin to…
13	the Clerk to call the roll.
14	COMMITTEE CLERK MARTIN: William Martin
15	Committee Clerk roll call vote, Committee on Health
16	Pre-Considered Introduction, Council Member Mendez?
17	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: I vote aye.
18	COMMITTEE CLERK MARTIN: Eugene?
19	COUNCIL MEMBER EUGENE: [off-mic] I vote
20	aye.
21	COMMITTEE CLERK MARTIN: Vacca?
22	COUNCIL MEMBER EUGENE: Aye.
23	COMMITTEE CLERK MARTIN: Barron?
24	COUNCIL MEMBER VACOMMITTEE CLERK MARTINA:
25	Aye.

4	Somebody voted when they called my name, Aye.

6	twice.
7	COMMITTEE CLERK MARTIN: Barron?
8	COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: Permission to
9	explain my vote?
10	COMMITTEE CLERK MARTIN: Okay
11	COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: I just want
12	[cross-talk]
13	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Permission
14	granted… [cross-talk]
15	COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON:to say that the
16	UniverSoul Circus has a stellar reputation. When they
17	first started I was Deputy the Executive Assistant
18	to the Superintendent in District 23 and he
19	understood the value of the circus and made
20	arrangements with them to have a sizable number of
21	our district population attend the circus so that
22	children could have that exposure so I certainly
23	understand the value especially since it is black
24	owned and black operated and children see themselves
25	in the positive light. So, I'm voting yes and hoping

2	that we can look further to see what we can do to
3	perpetuate this service, service, thank you.
4	COMMITTEE CLERK MARTIN: Cornegy?
5	COUNCIL MEMBER CORNEGY: Permission to
6	explain my vote?
7	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Permission
8	granted.
9	COUNCIL MEMBER CORNEGY: I would just
10	like to say that I'm, I'm voting yes on this bill and
11	look forward to working very closely with UniverSoul
12	Circus to try to find some remediation that will
13	allow not to have a negative impact on your business
14	model. So, I'm, I'm saying that I want to work
15	closely with you as we develop a strategy that works
16	and a model that's replicable in other industries
17	throughout the country so
18	BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Thank you Councilman.
19	COMMITTEE CLERK MARTIN: By a vote of
20	five in the affirmative, zero in the negative, and no
21	abstentions the item has been adopted by the
22	committee.
23	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: We're going to
24	leave the vote open for, for Council Member Johnson's
25	arrival and I, I just want to say I have not been to

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the circus since I was a little girl but I've heard 2 3 of your circus and your performances and by everything that I've been told that it is an, and 4 5 incredible act that you have and the, the most impressionable and exciting acts are the ones with 6 7 the humans in it. So, I do want to continue our dialogue and our discussion. I introduced this bill 8 9 11 and a half years ago, my intention was to have a ... more humane treatment and I felt that animals 10 11 particularly in traveling circuses by virtue of the 12 traveling and the schedule and the touring and traveling sometimes in box cars were not being 13 14 treated humanely. My intention has never been to ban 15 circuses and so I look forward to seeing how we can 16 help you transition to a model that complies with the 17 law. 18 BENJAMIN JOHNSON: Thank you very much 19 Council Member. 20 COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Thank you Mr. 21 Johnson. COMMITTEE CLERK MARTIN: Continuation of 2.2 23 the roll call, the Committee on Health, Council Member Espinal? 24 25

4	conversation about how we can mediate the, the impact

8	COMMITTEE CLERK MARTIN: Final vote in
9	Committee on Health, Pre-Considered Introduction has
10	now been adopted by a vote of six in the affirmative,
11	zero in the negative, and no abstentions.
12	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Okay, we've been
13	informed that Council Member Johnson has been further
14	detained so at this point we're going to close the
15	vote. This hearing has come to an end, thank you.
