CHAIRPERSON CABRERA: Are we ready? Okay. Good afternoon. I am Council Member Fernando Cabrera, Chairperson of the Juvenile Justice Committee. We are joined by Council Members Grodenchik, Lancman and Barron. We are here today to vote on three pieces of legislation that I have sponsored, which aim to assist in the rehabilitation of young people detained in the city's Juvenile Justice facility. Proposed Intro 1237-A will require ACS to conduct an internal review of the effectiveness of the agency's current system of maintaining health records created for youth detained in ACS facilities. This review would include examining whether electronic maintenance of records will improve overall effectiveness of the current system. With this, ACS will be required to submit a report to the Council regarding the recommended improvements to the health records maintenance system and the timeframe for information of such-such improvements. This bill is important-is an important step to ensuring that ACA continues to strive for its delivery of quality healthcare to young people detained in their facilities.

Next, we recognize the importance to support a family and community in guiding the rehabilitation of youth—of justice involved youth.

Proposed Intro 1461-A and Proposed Intro 1452-A aim to facilitate the maintenance and important relationships for youth detained in ACS facilities.

First, Proposed Intro 1451-A will require ACS to allow youth in detention facilities to designate visitors outside of their families including a coach, teacher, clergy person or other adults who has a positive relationship with a young person. Additionally, proposed Intro 1452-A will require ACS to allow young people in a secure detention facility to video conference with family. Together, these bills will work to keep the emphasis on rehabilitating our young people, and not pushing them by making sure youth in detention receive the best possible healthcare and to stay connected to their community. I would like to ask the committee Clerk to take a roll call on these pieces of legislation unless anybody has any comments. that, we'll take roll call.
