selection and acquisition in the Speaker's district. 2 3 LU 727 is an application submitted by the Department 4 of Sanitation and the Department of Citywide Administrative Services pursuant to Section 197-c of New York City Charter for the site selection and 6 acquisition of property located at 207-217 east 127th 7 Street, Block 1792, Lots 5 and part of 28 to 8 facilitate the location of the Department of Sanitation's Manhattan District 11 Garage and 10 11 Manhattan Lot Cleaning Unit and Manhattan Lot 12 Cleaning Unit Headquarters. This committee held a public hearing on this siting on July 27<sup>th</sup>. 13 we had a subcommittee meeting going on. Please be 14 15 quiet. This garage will replace the existing Sanitation Garage located at 343 East 99th Street, 16 17 which is undersized structurally and in size and 18 under pressure from hospital and residential 19 development on the block. Due to overcrowding, 20 Sanitation vehicles are currently forced to park on the street. The city will enter into a lease for 21 2.2 property for the new facility. The property owner 2.3 will retrofit the existing building to accommodate employee support space, office and small vehicles and 24 25 accessory parking. The owner will also construct a

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one-story building addition, which will store vehicles and include a wash bay and mechanic space. An outdoor parking area will accommodate up to 25-up to 24 collection trucks. The facility will have a total capacity of 41 vehicles. Although DSNY willalthough DSNY has changed the design to incorporate a more attractive façade than the original proposal. The proposed facility is still an enclosed, and there are still significant concerns about the lack of a permanent enclosed adequately size facility. For that reason, we will vote to approve LU 727 with the modification to limit the acquisition to a term of 20 years. DSNY has agreed to immediately begin planning for a permanent long-term facility to serve District 11's sanitation needs, which includes to following qoals:

There's four options for a permanent consolidated facility that could house multiple facilities including District 11, District 10, District 9, and/or the Manhattan Lot Cleaning Unit.

Create a state-of-the-art Sanitation facility that would be fully enclosed, and utilize the most advanced technology in air filtration, air efficiency and energy efficiency and storm water
