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CHAIRPERSON LEVINE: Okay, we're going to get started. Welcome everybody to the Committee of the City Council's Parks and Recreation Committee. We are going to be voting today on Intro 629-A, a Local Law to amend the Administrative Code of the City of New York in relation to the length of the season for city beaches and pools, which are historically closed on Labor Day, but in an era of global warning-warming, sadly the first week of September can often be very hot. As we witnessed yesterday-Today it's raining so not a good beach day, but we want our city's young people and families to have access to these very healthy resources, and the week after Labor Day when the school is sometimes out, as it was yesterday, and it's great for our health, and it's an outlet for people who can't afford to go to Miami or the Hamptons. So, there's a real equity component, and these wonderful free resources, and I'm please that we are going to be voting today on the bill that will enshrine this in law, an extension of the beach and full season to the Sunday beyond Labor Day. So, I'm going to pause for

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2 a moment, and see if any of my colleagues have any 3 comments. Yes, Council Member Treyger.

COUNCIL MEMBER TREYGER: Thank you very much, Chair, for your leadership on this issue. Perhaps I'll be a co-sponsor, but one issue I would just take note for the Parks Department moving forward is that already I've gotten feedback from residents in my district who love Coney Island Beach, and also Brighton Beach, too. That a number of the lifeguards that the Parks Department hires they are college students, and their college semesters begin sometimes in early August, and when-so when they go back to school and there is no lifeguard there at that beach section, they close off that section. so, I get complaints from a lot of residents that they're closing off section after section after section, and so even if we extend the beach season, is the Parks Department fully equipped with staff to provide these services to our residents? So, I just want to just make a note of that, and hopefully they can work out a way where they make the jobs more appealing and attractive to a broader universe, and pay them good wages and other things. Of course, we want to hire college kids and high school seniors as

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2	well, but, you know, the staffing issue remains to be
3	a problem. Thank you, Chair.
4	CHAIRPERSON LEVINE: It's-it's a great
5	point, and they struggled with that as you see on
6	Coney Island. You can't open a beach at all if you
7	don't have lifeguards because that's-that's a threat
8	to-to safety, and the bill does give the Parks
9	Department the ability to not open in case of sever
10	weather or safety issues that could be precipitated
11	by lack of staffing. We should do more recruiting
12	from local college students. There are so many in
13	the city, and we should make sure the jobs pay better
14	so we can attract better talent and keep them. So, a
15	very good point. Alright, I think I'm going to ask
16	Bill Martin the Committee Clerk to call the roll.
