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The environmental impact of this legislation, in terms of the number of trees saved by reducing the number of paper, is notable in and of itself. On top of that, Int. 1292-A is another critical step toward a modern and dynamic procurement process; this is exactly the approach we need to take as we reform the procurement process to make it easier for firms to do business with the City and to make it easier for the City to stretch its resources.

I'll now turn the floor over to Council Member Constantinides to share a few words.

COUNCIL MEMBER CONSTANTINIDES: Thank

you, Chair Rosenthal and thank you for your great

leadership on contracts; you know, bringing us into

that 21st century, kicking and screaming sometimes

[laugh, background comment]. But thank you for all

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the great work that you do around procurement and contracts in general; really making a difference for the businesses that interact with us and how we do

5 business in the City of New York. Thank you.

As a Council Member, my main focus has been on making our city more green and more sustainable; this Council has achieved a great deal this session, from 80 by 50, a revamping of the air code, groundbreaking environmental justice legislation, but there's a lot more we can do to ensure that even the smallest of government transactions are green as well. Every day the City agencies interact with hundreds of contractors from dozens of different fields; many, if not most times that they do, they generate a receipt, a procurement invoice or some other document for that transaction; that means that in the age of smartphones; tablets, hundreds of thousands of pieces of paper are still generated by City activity every week; there is simply no reason that we should still be doing this as a way of business; that's why 1292 is so important; it simply directs all City agencies accept vouchers and invoices electronically and instructs the Procurement Policy Board to promulgate rules to

2	assist them in doing so. As the Mayor's Office of
3	Contract Services has already made great progress
4	with the help of Chair Rosenthal making all these
5	things work via the HHS Accelerator and other
6	initiatives, we are already prepared to move to such
7	system. As the Federal Government has already moved
8	electronic procurement, there is simply no reason
9	that the City of New York is not ready to take the
LO	same leap. With this simple bill we can save
L1	hundreds of trees over the course of each year and
L2	when each of those trees can absorb up to 48 pounds
L3	of carbon per year, we've made another big step
L4	towards meeting our 80 by 50 goal. Thank you.
