CHAIRPERSON MENCHACA: Buenos dias a todos. I am Council Member Carlos Menchaca; I'm chair of the New York City's Council Committee on Immigration. Today the Committee on Immigration will vote on a preconsidered resolution that would authorize the Speaker to file or join amicus briefs on behalf of the Council in litigation challenging the rescission or modification of the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, known as DACA, which provides temporary immigration relief to certain undocumented youth.

As you know, this is a topic that is very near and dear to my heart. I have been a champion for undocumented youth and young adults. Dreamers deserve the right to attain the American dream and it is our job to ensure that these hardworking youth and young adults are supported every step of the way.

The term "dreamer" is used to describe young undocumented immigrants who were brought to the U.S. as children and know this country to be their home. Dreamers assimilate into American schools and internalize American beliefs; sadly, without a path to legal immigration status or a meaningful opportunity to pursue their education and professional development, dreamers are forced to live in the shadows. In light of congressional inaction on immigration reform, in 2012 President Obama created the DACA program which provides temporary protection from deportation and work authorization to certain dreamers who are in school or who obtain the high school diploma or GED in the United States.

In September of this year, the Trump

Administration terminated the DACA program effective

March 2018, allowing only a small subset of DACA

recipients to renew their status one last time. In

response, the New York State Attorney General and 16

other states sued the federal government, alleging

that the abrupt termination of the program was

discriminatory in nature and also violated the constitutional rights of DACA recipients.

The Preconsidered Resolution being voted on today would allow the Speaker of the City Council to file or join supporting briefs in litigation to defend the DACA program and protect dreamers, our New Yorkers, our brothers and sisters, our family. This falls in line with this Council's longstanding commitment to supporting our city's immigrant youth.
