CHAIRPERSON WILLIAMS: Good afternoon

everyone. My name is Jumaane Williams, Chair of the

Housing and Buildings Committee. I'm joined today by

Council Members Mendez, Salamanca, Espinal, Levin...

sorry, Levin, Crowley, Ulrich, Torres and Grodenchik.

We're here... I skipped you, my bad... I said Cornegy, I

COUNCIL MEMBER CORNEGY: No, you did not.

CHAIRPERSON WILLIAMS: That was on purpose, no, sorry, Cornegy. We are here to hold a vote on two bills. The first bill proposed Intro Number 1307-A specifies qualification for the Department of Building inspector. We heard this bill on January 13th... I'm sorry, we heard this bill on June 13th and received testimony from the Plumbing Foundation, the American Council of Engineering Companies and the American Institute of Architects. The original version of this bill loosened requirements for all inspectors and in response to the feedback we received we kept the current most stringent requirements for inspectors who inspect medical and natural gas piping systems, back flow prevention and electrical work and loosening

qualifications for inspectors who conduct other types
of inspections. This was due to the DOB's inability
to fill all of the, the positions they had available
to move forward with the safe and health and well-
being of the whole city when we're going putting
buildings up. The second bill proposed Intro Number
1436-A sponsored by Council Member Matteo would
require DOB to report on safety site managers sorry,
on site safety managers and coordinator certificates
including the number of certificates, the number of
sites which required a site safety manager or
coordinator. The number of certificates issued, the
number of applicants filed the number of
applications filed, I'm sorry, the average time of
for approval of an application and the average time
for completion of the background check. I'd like to
thank my staff for the work they did to assemble this
including Mike Toomey, my Legislative Director; Megan
Chin, Council to the Committee; Jose Conde, Policy
Analyst to the Committee and Sarah Gastelum the
Committee's Finance Analyst. I do want to just
mention, mention there has been some question about
1307-A and we did do some thoughtful analysis on this
and changed the bill based on what we heard back from

5	should be doing the work but I, I do believe that the
6	Chair had this concept in mind in fashioning this
7	bill and, so I will be voting aye on all. Thank you.

COUNCIL MEMBER ULRICH: I am voting no on Proposed Intro 1307-A because I think it lowers the qualifications and puts New Yorkers at risk, I'm voting yes on 1436, I will explain more about my vote at tomorrows stated. Thank you.
