5	todos. I am Carlos Menchaca no, I'm not; I'm
6	Councilman Rafael Espinal; not the chair of the New
7	York City Council's Committee on Immigration, but I
8	am a member of the Committee. I would like to thank
9	you all for being here. I would also like to
10	recognize the members of all three committees and
11	additional Council Members joining us; we have
12	Council Member Mathieu Eugene from Brooklyn and we
13	have Council Member Peter Koo from Queens.
14	Addressing the needs of immigrant New
15	Yorkers has never been more critical; that is why
16	today the Committee on Immigration will vote on a
17	package of bills that clearly establish that New York
18	City will not be part of the federal deportation
19	machine.
20	I would also like to take note that the
21	Committee on Education will be voting on a bill that
22	ensures parents have accurate information about the
23	DOE's policies regarding student record
24	confidentiality and requests for assistance from non-
25	local law enforcement, including ICE.

2 Additionally, the Committee on Public 3 Safety voted on a bill that creates a new local 4 alternative for the state's disorderly conduct charge that carries a lower maximum sentence. This gives 5 law enforcement judges and prosecutors a tool to 6 7 ensure that the punishment matches the crime and reduces the risk that a low-level offense triggers 8 9 collateral consequences, including those related to immigration benefits. 10

11 And now back to the two bills in our 12 committee. As you know, the City has limited the 13 circumstances under which the NYPD and the Department 14 of Corrections may cooperate with immigration 15 authorities on immigration enforcement since 2011. 16 Intro 1558-A, sponsored by The Speaker and Ferreras-17 Copeland, would expand on that work by limiting the 18 Department of Probation's cooperation with 19 immigration authorities in the same way as the 20 Department of Corrections. Additionally, 21 Intro 1568-A, sponsored by myself, Councilman 2.2 Espinal, Councilman Corey Johnson and Speaker Melissa 23 Mark-Viverito prohibits the use of City resources for the purpose of immigration enforcement to the fullest 24 25 extent permitted by the law. Further, the bill

2	prohibits law enforcement from entering into formal
3	partnerships with ICE, established by 287 agreements.
4	The City already cooperates with ICE on its own terms
5	through detainer laws; any broader or formal
6	arrangement would erode public trust in law
7	enforcement and city agencies; it also wastes local
8	taxpayer dollars.
9	The President's irresponsible rhetoric
10	and discriminatory policies are an affront to all New
11	Yorkers and do not fall in line with our core values
12	like inclusion, respect for personal privacy,
13	compassion, and the rule of law. New York City finds
14	strength in diversity, innovation, inclusion,
15	justice, and fairness; that is how we've overcome the
16	odds in the past and that's how we will keep moving
17	forward. [background comments] Okay; with that

19	MAYA GURUNG: Maya Gurung. Good
20	afternoon Chairman Espinal and Committee members. My
21	name is Maya Gurung and I am also a temporary
22	protected recipient; I am also a case coordinator at
23	Adhikaar, a worker center and community center based
24	in Woodside, Queens that serves the Nepali-speaking
25	community. We are here today to express our

COMMITTEE ON IMMIGRATION resounding support for Resolution 1638, calling upon 2 3 the Homeland Security Secretary to extend TPS for all 4 current TPS-designated countries.

On April 25, 2015, my family in Nepal and 5 hundreds of thousands of others were directly 6 7 impacted by the devastating earthquake. Everyone in my family was in shock; my uncles' homes were broken 8 9 and the entire country was in chaos. My family urged me against going back, saying it was more helpful for 10 11 me to remain here in the States to support their and Nepal's recovery. I am one of the 8,950 recipients. 12

13 At Adhikaar, we provided our services to 14 around 2,000 people for TPS in 2015 and 2016. We 15 organized TPS clinics with different legal service 16 providers in New York City and supported people from all around the country with their questions. 17

18 TPS has given thousands of individuals 19 and their families a sense of security regarding 20 their immigration status and work permits helping 21 people contribute to the U.S. economy and income to 2.2 support family back in Nepal. Many now also have 23 driver's licenses, bank accounts, and health insurance; all important aspects of building a 24 stable, productive life. College graduates have been 25

2	able to get jobs to support the U.S. and Nepal's
3	economy. TPS recipients are taxpaying families whose
4	homes and lives are now rooted here in the U.S.
5	When the decision for Haiti and Sudan
6	were announced, I was scared for myself and all the
7	people with TPS. In this current climate, where
8	immigrants are under attack, our future seems like a
9	mere political game [bell] for people in Washington.
10	Nepal is still struggling with recovery from the
11	earthquake which struck during the recovery from
12	civil war.
13	The City of New York is no stranger to
14	long bouts [sic] of recovery; yesterday was the five-
15	year anniversary of Superstorm Sandy and many
16	families here are still in the process of recovering,
17	and now, after the massive floods in Southern Nepal,
18	more people are facing life-threatening conditions;
19	going back to Nepal is simply not an option. My life
20	is here; I have lived in the United States for over
21	six years and my home is here in Adhikaar; my
22	community is her in New York. Every day I and
23	thousands like me worry about whether we will be able
24	to stay and what will become of our families if we
25	are displaced and forced back to Nepal. The

2	uncertainty is a terribly precarious and unstable way
3	of life. Due to recent natural and political
4	disasters, we need Nepal to be redesignated for TPS;
5	we hope the New York City Council will support
6	immigrant families by passing Resolution 1638. We
7	would offer two suggestions to the resolution: 1. an
8	amendment to the whereas clause on Nepal that
9	includes the recovery from the ten-year civil war and
10	the recent mass flood in [inaudible], and 2. a
11	pathway to citizenship for TPS recipients whose homes
12	and lives are grounded here in the U.S.
13	Thank you for your consideration of our
14	suggestions to Resolution 1638 and for your support.
