3 CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: Good morning. 4 My name is David Greenfield. I'm the Council Member from the 44<sup>th</sup> Street in Brooklyn. I'm privileged to 5 6 serve as the Chair of the Land Use Committee. I want to welcome my esteemed colleagues who are members of 8 the committee. Council Member Gentile, Council 9 Member Palma, Council Member Mealy, Council Member 10 Mendez, Council Member Rodriguez, Chair Koo, Council 11 Member Rose, Chair Richards, Council Member Cohen, 12 Council Member Grodenchik and Chair Salamanca, and 13 Council Member Torres, and Council Member Reynoso. 14 want to thank Chair Salamanca, Chair Richards and 15 Chair Koo for outstanding work on our Land Use 16 Subcommittees especially Chair Salamanca for his work 17 this morning. Today, we'll be voting on the Edwins 18 Place Rezoning, LU 792 through 795. In this 19 application, HPD is seeking the rezoning from an R6 20 to R7-2/C2-3, the zoning text amendment to establish 21 an MIH area special permit to allow community 22 facility floor area to apply to non-profit supporting 23 housing and urban development action area designation 24 and project approval, and to dispose of city owned 25 property. These approves facilitate the development

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of 8-story, 125-unit supportive housing development with ground floor retail and community space located at 3 Livonia Avenue in Council Member Mealy's district. Just before this meeting, the Planning Subcommittee put in a recommendation to approve the application. This recommendation was in accordance with Council Member Mealy's recommendation for the application. We'll also be voting to approve this application, but first if the Councilwoman would like, I would invite Council Member Mealy to make a statement on the application.

COUNCIL MEMBER MEALY: [off mic] Yes, I would just--

COUNCIL MEMBER GREENFIELD: Would you like to make a statement, Council Member? Thank you.

COUNCIL MEMBER MEALY: Yes, I just want to thank my colleagues for this opportunity for your support also, and I want to thank for Breaking Grounds for giving their input in our community just as well, and I want to thank my Mayor for the three centers that we're getting in our—in Brownsville community now. I want to thank Mark Treyger, my colleader of the Brooklyn Delegation for being a real trooper with me, and Annabel Palma. I want to thank

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you Ralph—Rafael and David Greenfield. I want to thank you all for all that you have done and Brownsville is better off now. Even in my departure, we still will have what the community needs, and that's a boxing gym, and dance theater, and an anchor bank an MCU. So, I want to thank the mayor and all my colleagues, and thank you Breaking Grounds for the input that you've given to the community. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: Thank you very much Council Member. I want to congratulate everyone involved over here as well. I want to recognize we've been joined by Council Members Williams and Lander as well. I want to just state that I actually had the privilege of serving quite a few years as cochair along with Council Member Mealy at the Brooklyn Delegation, and she is someone who is completely dedicated to her constituents in a way that very few Council members are, and her achievement today, which was taking a project and creating a holistic wraparound service for this project was really astonishing. And some of the highlights that's just worth noting for the record in terms of her accomplishments, this project now includes 51 unit of traditional affordable housing including 1-bedrooms,

2 2-bedrooms and 3-bedrooms. That is all with the 3 assistance of this Council Member. The project now 4 includes \$50,000 in annual funding to support operation of a local community boxing gym to help make sure that there are services for the community. 6 7 This project includes a commitment that—which is 8 important that there's going to be holistic use including the renovation of the Brownsville Recreation Center, a project that is estimated 10 11 costing approximately \$16.5 million, which is to the 12 Council Member's credit as well. The project also 13 includes a commitment from Breaking Ground that there will be staff on site 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. 14 15 There is going to be extra interior closed circuit TV 16 monitors to ensure security, and Breaking Ground is 17 now committed to programming for seniors as well. 18 And I just want to point to folks that, you know, 19 people routinely wonder and try to understand why it 20 is that we have Council input on these projects. 21 This is why because of those that I would have 2.2 mentioned not the \$350,000 in funding, not the upgrades to Brownsville Recreational Center for \$16.5 2.3 million, not the complete change of the project where 24 there's not going to be 51 units of standard 25

2	affordable housing, 1-bedroom, 2-bedrooms and 3-
3	bedrooms. None of that would have happened without
4	Council Mealy's insistence, and I can assure you that
5	late into the night she was working together with her
6	co-chair, and I want to recognize him as well,
7	Council Member Mark Treyger to negotiate these
8	details with the administration. I was happy to work
9	together with Chair Salamanca on this as well, and
10	our future Deputy Commission who played a significant
11	role, and we want to thank you as well, Council
12	Member Palma for your work and, of course, Umay (sp?)
13	in the Mayor's Office who was very instrumental, and
14	Jordan from HPD, and the folks at Breaking Ground who
15	had partnered with us. And this is a true because
16	ship because in the end of the day, the city needs,
17	but how those needs get matched up in the individual
18	districts is exactly what this Council is all about.
19	That's we saw here today and this is really a great
20	success. So, congratulations, Council Member Mealy,
21	and I thoroughly recommend an aye vote on this
22	project.

did here, and just what they're trying to do in		
housing in general across the city. Congratulations
