are not already included in the Open Data Portal.

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Currently agencies must review FOIL

responses that include the release of data and

determine if these responses contain data that has

not been included in the Open Data Portal. However,

until now, the law has only required statistics on

these datasets to be included in the compliance plan.

The second piece of legislation we are voting on today is Intro 1707, which I introduced with Manhattan Borough President Gale Brewer. This bill includes multiple provisions and resulted from conversations with numerous stakeholders. One provision of Intro 1707 changes the timeline for the compliance plan published by DoITT, pushing it from July to September.

The purpose of this is to better accommodate the internal processes of agencies and the open data team. The legislation also requires that the head of each City agency designates an employee to serve as the open data coordinator responsible for ensuring that such an agency complies with the Open Data Law and receives feedback from the public; this will codify a current provision in the Technical Standards Manual. Additionally, 1707 mandates that a department receive the Technical

2 Standard Manual every two years and provide a method 3 for public comment.

Another provision in the legislation will require DoITT to collect and public data on the web portal itself, codifying another current departmental practice.

Lastly, this legislation will mandate that DoITT provide specific information on the status of all public datasets; this final provision will undoubtedly allow the Council and the public to more easily access the progress of open data and the City's compliance and to identify additional areas for improvement.
