Proposed Intro No. 461-A would require the Department of Education, by June 1st of each year, to post and distribute information about the availability of summer meals, including where and when such meals are available and eligibility requirements for such meals. The information would be required to be posted on the DOE's website, the website of any City agency collaborating with DOE to provide meals, and the 311 website, and also distributed to Council Members, Borough Presidents, Community Boards, community education councils, parent associations, and parent-teacher associations.

The programs that the City offers to support children and families can only be successful if people take advantage of the opportunity and families can only utilize such programs if they know how to access them. This bill will help families to understand the options available to them for meals over the summer and I strongly support this legislation.
