CHAIRPERSON CONSTANTINIDES: Alright, 3 4 fantabulous. [gavel] Good-good morning. I am Costa 5 Constantinides, Chair of the environmental Protection 6 Committee, and today the committee will hold and hear-hold and hear a vote on Intro 1651-A, a Local 8 Law to amend the Administrative Code of the City of 9 New York in relation to modering-monitoring 10 electricity and fossil fuel usage in certain 11 facilities. In July 2014, City Controller Scott 12 Spring--Stringer audited the Department of Citywide 13 Administrative Services, DCAS Energy Conservation 14 efforts. He found that benchmarking in city 15 buildings are incomplete. He found that not enough 16 was being done to ensure that the department's 17 efficiency goals and measures are being implemented, 18 and he found there was no official procedure for 19 prioritizing buildings for energy efficiency 20 projects. Subsequent investigations also include 21 that DCAS had very little information on heat loss 2.2 and fossil fuel use particularly oil in city's 23 buildings. This Local Law will require DCAS to 24 provide an annual report on electricity and fossil 25 fuel-fossil fuel use in certain city-owned buildings

2	including identifying whether such buildings have
3	been fitted with equipment for monitoring-monitoring
4	energy usage in near real time. The report will also
5	require assessments and improvements to building
6	envelopes. This bill will also require DCAS in
7	conjunction with appropriate city agencies to
8	coordinate the installation of energy usage equipment
9	and any necessary software in all city buildings that
10	DCAS identifies as appropriate to receive such
11	installation. We are joined here this morning by
12	Council Members Lancman and Richards, members of the
13	committee, and at this time I recommend a yes vote.
