4 CHAIRPERSON GENTILE: Okay, we're ready 5 I'm Council Member Vincent Gentile, and I am to go. 6 the Chairman of the Oversight and Investigation 7 Committee. I'd like to thank my colleagues joining 8 me today, Council Member Bill Perkins, Council Member 9 Chaim Deutsch, Council Member Danny Dromm, Council Member Helen Rosenthal and Council Member Rory 10 11 Lancman. Today we will be holding a vote on two 12 pieces of legislation that look to improve the 13 efficiency, effectiveness, transparency of municipal 14 government operations to the betterment of New 15 Yorkers. Intro 16-1618-A sponsored by me and Council 16 Members Dromm, Lancman, Rosenthal and Torres will 17 require that the Department of Investigation conduct 18 public outreach efforts to educate the public on how 19 to identify and submit complaints regarding different 20 forms of government corruption, fraud and waste. The 21 Department will also be required to submit yearly 22 public reports detailing complaints received, the 23 mechanism through which complaints are submitted, and 24 a summary of the relevant outreach efforts undertaken 25 by the agency in the previous yea. 1 COMMITTEE ON OVERSIGHT AND INVESTIGATIONS 4 2 City's Inspectors General and the oldest law 3 enforcement agency in the city, DOI receives 4 approximately 12,000 complaints a year. Currently, they voluntarily conduct advertising campaigns on a 5 periodic basis. Most recently developing and print 6 7 and media ad advertisements in in 2016 with the 8 slogan "Bribery and corruption are a trap. Don't get 9 caught up. Report it." I-I commend the Commissioner and the department for committing valuable resources 10 11 to raising awareness of the public, of the important 12 role the public plays in assisting DOI in rooting out 13 corruption within our city government. Jointly we took DOI's proactive initiative a step forward by 14 15 requiring this-this legislation that public outreach 16 be conducted each year. Additionally, the reporting 17 requirement calls for the publication of the number 18 of complaints received, disaggregated by the 19 mechanism through with the complaint was submitted, 20 and a summary of relevant outreach activities in an 21 effort to assess the efficacy of the outreach. Intro 2.2 1618-A will expand the existing practice and further 23 the public's involvement in reporting wrongdoings to the DOI to promote an honest and efficient city 24 government. Intro 1633-A also sponsored by me as 25

2	well as Council Members Rosenthal and Crowley will
3	require that the Department of Investigation must
4	complete vendor name checks for prospective city
5	vendors 30 days prior to commencement off the city
6	contract. One of DOI's basic agency goals is to
7	ensure that all background investigations and
8	fingerprinting checks are conducted in a timely
9	manner. Vendor check-and vendor name checks known as
10	VENDEX examine whether a prospective vendor or an
11	affiliated individual has been previously subject to
12	a DOI investigation. This is a large component of
13	the DO—of DOI fulfilling their annual goal, and is an
14	essential component of protecting the city and
15	taxpayers from fraudulent-from fraudulent
16	contractors. And my phone. [phone ringing] There we
17	go. As Commissioner Peters testified at this
18	committee's preliminary budget hearing in March,
19	Currently DOI completes approximately 94% of vendor
20	name checks within the 30-day window prescribed by
21	the Rules of the City of New York. Intro 1633-A will
22	codify within the city Charter the 30-day timeframe
23	for the completion of vendor name checks to ensure
24	that future administrations continue this vital
25	practice of guaranteeing the responsibility and

2	trustworthiness of vendors vying for city contracts.
3	Additionally, this bill would require the department
4	-DOI to provide an explanation to an agency if its
5	review of a vendor is not completed within 30 days.
6	Both of these pieces of legislation will improve the
7	information sharing, codifying important government
8	procedures and engage the public and in general
9	improve New York City government's daily functions. I
10	want to thank the Commissioner of the Department of
11	Investigation, Commissioner Mark Peters for working
12	closely with us on this package as well as the
13	Director of Intergovernmental Affairs, Jerry Powell.
14	I also want to thank our Committee Counsel Josh
15	Kingsley, my Legislative Director Jonathan
16	Chubchahees (sp?) and the stakeholders that have
17	testified in favor of these bills during our hearing
18	in June. As Chair, I recommend an aye vote from the
19	committee members. So, any members have any
20	questions or comments? Okay, seeing none, I ask the
21	Clerk to please call the roll.

23	Committee on Oversight and Investigations, roll call
24	vote on Intros 1618-A and 1633-A. Chair Gentile.
