6	Good afternoon; I am Council Member Constantinides,
7	chair of the Environmental Protection Committee and
8	today the Committee will hear and vote on Intro 1637-
9	A, a bill that requires New York City to develop a
10	long-term energy plan and to create an energy policy
11	subcommittee to guide the transition away from the
12	use of fossil fuels.
13	Three years ago the Council enacted Local
14	Law 66 of 2014 mandating to reduce our greenhouse gas
15	80 percent by 2050; this reduction will not happen by
16	itself, we have to take many proactive steps to make
17	it happen. This legislation is one of those steps;
18	it requires that we create a long-term energy plan
19	and an energy policy advisory subcommittee. The
20	subcommittee will review our current energy use
21	supply, develop a summary of the current citywide
22	energy demand, and create a projection of the future
23	citywide energy demand over the next four years.
24	The subcommittee's plan would also
25	include an estimate of renewable energy sources

1 COMMITTEE ON ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION 4 2 integrated into the energy supply, an accounting of 3 energy efficiency measures that have been deployed in 4 the city and specific recommendations of renewable 5 energy sources and energy efficiency measures that 6 could feasibly be developed and integrated by the 7 City.

8 New York City is responsible for one 9 percent of the greenhouse gases in the entire nation; while New York City must continue to grow, we must 10 11 grow responsibly; that means we must meet our 12 commitment to reduce our greenhouse gases, which is 13 even that more urgent, as the federal government has 14 ceased to lead us in the right direction that New 15 York City must lead. The only sustainable way to the 16 future is to reduce and transition away from the use 17 of fossil fuels; this bill will help us develop the 18 plan to accomplish just that.

I wanna thank the lead sponsor of this bill, Council Member Johnson for his leadership and also recognize we have both Council Member Richards from Queens and Council Member Levin from Brooklyn here today. I wanna thank the staff who worked on this bill -- Samara Swanston, our staff attorney;
