CHAIRPERSON LEVINE: Good morning and welcome to the City Council's Committee on Parks and Recreation. I'm Mark Levine, Chair. We're going to be considering today Intro 1466 sponsored by Parks Committee member and City Council Majority Leader Van Bramer. This bill we originally considered at our hearing December 5<sup>th</sup> and it would require the Parks Department to clean playground equipment in city parks within 24 hours after the spraying of pesticides by any city agency particularly spraying for West Nile virus. I believe that Intro 1466 is a common-sense approach which takes an extra step to ensure children in playgrounds are not exposed to residual pesticide applications and I urge my colleagues to vote in support of this measure. We do have quorum, I'm very excited, I'm going to pause and see if our bill sponsor, Majority Leader Van Bramer would like to make any remarks.

COUNCIL MEMBER VAN BRAMER: Thank you very much, I'll be very brief Mr. Chair and say thank you for your support, thank you to my colleagues.

There are few things if anything that we can do that's more important than making sure that all

children are safe and cared for and that parents can
take their children to the playground with peace of
mind knowing that their children are going to be
safe, making sure that we wipe down and clean
equipment after pesticide spraying occurs seems to me
like something that just about every single person
would want to happen to make sure that every child is
safe, every parent has peace of mind and that's why
we put the measure forward and that's why I hope
everyone chooses to support this bill. Thank you.
