Int. 54-A – Local Law 27

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of city of New York, in relation to the use of alternative fuels and alternative fuel technologies in the city ferry fleet.

Int. 880-A – Local Law 28

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of city of New York, in relation to the use of biodiesel fuel in school buses.

Int. 1036-A – Local Law 29

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of city of New York, in relation to the census of vacant properties.

Int. 1039-A – Local Law 30

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of city of New York, in relation to city-owned vacant properties that may be suitable for the development of affordable housing.

Int. 1465-A – Local Law 31

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of city of New York, in relation to phasing out the use of residual fuel oil and fuel oil grade no. 4 in boilers in in-city power plants.

Int. 1629-A – Local Law 32

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of city of New York, in relation to requiring periodic recommendations on adoption of more stringent energy efficiency requirements for certain buildings.


Int. 1632-A – Local Law 33
