CHAIRPERSON DROMM: Okay, good morning
everyone and welcome to today's finance committee
meeting. My name is Council Member Daniel Dromm and
I'm the Chair of the committee. Today we are joined
by Council Member's Keith Powers, Robert Cornegy,
Rory Lancman, Jimmy Van Bramer, Barry Grodenchik,
Adrienne Adams, Helen Rosenthal and Steve Matteo.
Okay, today the committee will be voting on eight
items, five Land Use Items, a transparency resolution
and two resolutions to approve the council's fiscal
operating budget, fiscal operating budget for 2019.
Let's start with the Land Use Items. The first is Red
Hook Gardens in Council Member Menchaca's district in
Brooklyn which would provide a full 19-year Article
11, tax exemption to support the preservation of 62
units of low income rental housing. The second item
is 346 East 21 st Street in Council Member Rivera's
district in Manhattan, this would provide a full 40-
year Article 11 tax exemption to support the
preservation of 30 units of low income rental
housing. The third, fourth and fifth items are in
Council Member Levine's district in Manhattan in
Manhattan and are projects relating to Columbia

2	University's expansion in Manhattanville. Each of the							
3	three properties would receive a full 40-year Article							
4	11 exemption to collectively support the new							
5	construction of 42 co-op units for low income							
6	households, all three Council Members are supportive							
7	of these projects. Next, we have the transparency							
8	resolution which sets forth the new designation and							
9	changes in the designation of certain organizations							
10	receiving local aging and youth discretionary funding							
11	and funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the							
12	budget. Organizations appearing in the resolution							
13	that have not yet completed the prequalification							
14	process conducted by the Office Mayor's Office of							
15	Contract Services, the Council or other entity are							
16	identified in the attached charts with an asterisk.							
17	As with all transparency resolutions Council Members							
18	will have to sign a disclosure form indicating							
19	whether or not a conflict exists with any of the							
20	groups on the attached list. If any Council Member							
21	has a potential conflict of interest with any of the							
22	organizations listed, he or she has the opportunity							
23	to disclose the conflict at the time of their vote.							
24	As a reminder please disclose any conflicts you may							
25	have with proposed subcontractors used by							

2	organizations supported by discretionary funding.							
3	These disclosures must be made before the							
4	subcontractor can be approved. Marly Marcellus from							
5	the General Council's Office is here and can assist							
6	you with any questions or concerns regarding							
7	disclosures. And last, we have the Council's Fiscal							
8	2019 Operating Budget which totals 81.4 million							
9	dollars. This is divided into 62.3 million dollars							
10	for personnel services and 19.1 million dollars for							
11	other than personnel services. Unless there are any							
12	questions on today's items I will ask Billy Marin,							
13	the Committee Clerk to call the roll.
