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3 CHAIRPERSON REYNOSO: Give me a couple 4 seconds. The members are sitting. [pause] Let's 5 go. [background comments, pause] Alright. [gavel] 6 Welcome everybody-everyone to the Committee on 7 Sanitation and Solid Waste Management. My name is 8 Council Member Antonio Reynoso. I am the chair. I 9 want to thank my colleagues for being here, Council 10 Member Vallone, Deutsch and Cabrera. I want to thank 11 the members of the Committee for attending today's 12 vote. As you all are aware, Intro 157 is a 13 critically important piece of legislation that will 14 bring equity to our city's waste processing system, 15 and deliver environmental justice to low-income communities of color in North Brooklyn, the South 16 17 Bronx and Southeast Queens. This bill has faced 18 significant political obstacles during my time in the 19 City Council having been introduced under three 20 different Speakers. However, I know my colleagues 21 understand the deep inequities present in our current 22 system, and I trust they will join me in delivering a 23 measure of justice that has eluded residents of these 24 communities for so long. I have worked tirelessly 25 for over-for over-almost a decade to pass this bill

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2	holing countless meeting with the industry,
3	advocates, community residents and Council
4	colleagues. This bill has been-seen countless
5	versions introduced and amended. We have done this
6	analysis. We have heard from all sides. It is now
7	time to act. Our communities can no longer wait, and
8	I would like to now ask my colleagues to join in
9	voting in favor of Intro 157. Before I call the
10	vote, I just want to ask if any Council Members have
11	anything to say. Any comments? Some comments.
12	COUNCIL MEMBER: [off mic] Yes.
13	CHAIRPERSON REYNOSO: Alright, I-[pause]
14	Alright, So, I'll ask for the Clerk to call the vote,
15	and we've also been joined by Council Member Espinal.
16	CLERK: William Martin, Committee Clerk,
17	roll call vote Committee on Sanitation and Solid
18	Waste Management, Introduction 157-C, Chair Reynoso.
19	CHAIRPERSON REYNOSO: I vote aye.
20	CLERK: Cabrera.
21	COUNCIL MEMBER CABRERA: Permission to
22	explain my vote.
23	CHAIRPERSON REYNOSO: yes.
24	COUNCIL MEMBER CABRERA: Thank you so
25	much. [coughing] Well, I'm going to be voting no

COMMITTEE ON SANITATION AND SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT 1 5 2 today for a couple of reasons. The first reason is being to jobs. Jobs, jobs, real jobs. 3 I'm talking 4 about union jobs, Teamster's jobs. We're talking 5 about people that today they're going to be hearing-6 they start hearing about the fact that we're starting 7 to set in motion here a position where hundreds of people are going to lose their jobs. We talked about 8 that this bill's intention is-is to help those in the 9 10 community where are people of color. Well, the reality is that a lot of other people who are going 11 12 to lose their job are people of color. That's the irony of-of this bill, and-and you'll have struggle 13 14 with this bill from the beginning because I don't see 15 a win situation for people in our community that are 16 going to be affected in every borough. The same recent struggle with this bill is that we're going to 17 18 be talking about this truck, buses, trucks that are going to be now traveling farther. I just don't see 19 20 the logic of having trucks travel farther and then we have a carbon footprint that is going to be longer. 21 2.2 I just don't see the logic on that, and very recent I 23 have visited some of the stations, and this is hard work. I mean this is work that probably half of us in 24 25 this room couldn't do this type of work, and I find

2	it ironic that we at the Council give funding to non-
3	profit organizations who those very non-profit
4	organizations, which do fantastic work-fantastic work
5	refer people to these very stations who are now are
6	not going to be able to do that because you're going
7	to have people actually losing their job and not
8	getting a job. So, for that reason, Mr. Chairman,
9	I'm going to be voting no on this. Thank you so
10	much.
11	CHAIRPERSON REYNOSO: Thank you.
12	CLERK: Deutsch.
13	COUNCIL MEMBER DEUTSCH: Can I please
14	explain my vote?
15	CHAIRPERSON REYNOSO: [off mic]
16	COUNCIL MEMBER DEUTSCH: So, is that yes?
17	CHAIRPERSON REYNOSO: Yes, oh, yes, yes.
18	I apologize.
19	COUNCIL MEMBER DEUTSCH: Thank you,
20	Chair. So, any time we vote on a piece of legislation
21	it's-it's not for the short-short-term. It's for the
22	long-term and it makes an impact on New York City
23	residents, and it's not always an easy decision, and
24	specific—specifically, this bill 157 I have met with
25	advocates on both sides-on both sides, and people

2	from the carting industry, and those who-who
3	represent the environmental issues that affect New
4	York City residents, and I had to come up with a
5	decision, and I really wanted to understand the pros
6	and cons of what this bill will have on—on our city
7	as a whole and in addition to that, I did receive
8	yesterday a number of phone calls on the 12 <sup>th</sup> Hour
9	and also people approaching me over the last three or
10	four hours telling me why it's good or why it's not
11	good, but, you know, I'm always accessible, and I
12	always like to learn, and I always like to hear from-
13	from people whether they support a bill or not, and
14	understand how I should vote. So, that being said,
15	after reviewing this bill, and speaking to many
16	people and some individuals as manymeeting them as
17	many as three or four times, I just want to
18	congratulate Antonio Reynoso and Steve Levin, and I
19	will vote yes on 157.
20	CHAIRPERSON REYNOSO: Thank you.
21	CLERK: Espinal.
22	COUNCIL MEMBER ESPINAL: I vote aye.
23	CLERK: Vallone.
24	COUNCIL MEMBER VALLONE: A moment to
25	explain my vote?

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2	CHAIRPERSON REYNOSO: Yes.
3	COUNCIL MEMBER VALLONE: So, with all the
4	hard work on this this bill, I just wanted to put
5	onto the record that as a Council Member, I am aware
6	of my father's consulting firm has clients
7	potentially affected by this bill, but at no time
8	have I been lobbied by any member of the firm. The
9	aimed goal or potential of this bill is to regulate
10	and reduce the amount of waste particular communities
11	can handle in this legislation, and hope before it
12	passes with some additional amendments will help
13	bring relief to the neighborhoods such as College
14	Point. So, I'm voting yes on this bill. Thank you.
15	CHAIRPERSON REYNOSO: Thank you and I
16	would like to call on Council Member Daneek Miller
17	from Queens for a statement.
18	COUNCIL MEMBER MILLER: Thank you, Chair.
19	Let me just say—let me begin by saying that from its
20	inception I think from the time that I became a
21	member of this Council I was introduced to then 495
22	and by Council Member Reynoso and its met and on
23	it's—on it's merits I absolutely unequivocally was
24	100% behind it, the-the fact that there were
25	communities that were being disproportionately

Over the past year we have worked-I think that the goal of this bill is for us to be better, 3 4 for us mitigate and alleviate these conditions that communities of color and other communities throughout 5 6 the city find themselves in. I think that what this 7 bill has ended up being is punitive and it is a legislation that dissuades any investment in 8 communities that would make it better that there is 9 an opportunity particularly in Community Board 12 to 10 provide state-of-the art waste transfer and recycle 11 12 facilities, something that we can be proud of, something that I think is everybody's objective here 13 in this Council, and I think that the bill certainly 14 15 by not including myself Council Member Adams and 16 others being impacted we missed an opportunity to really drill down and be better and be a model for 17 18 what waste transfer and recycle throughout not just the city, but the country can be, and I'm hoping that 19 20 we're-that there's opportunity upon implementation that we quantify what exactly a 10% threshold is, who 21 2.2 is fixing that threshold and when-when, where and how 23 these cuts come into place. Certainly, I remain willing to work with the Chairman and this committee 24 25 and others to-in order to facilitate that, but the

COMMITTEE ON SANITATION AND SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT 10 2 goals are admirable goals, but the outcome at this 3 moment is certainly something that I-I don't agree 4 with, but I look forward to working with the Chair. 5 Thank you. Thank you for allowing me to speak.

6 CHAIRPERSON REYNOSO: I just want to say 7 to Council Member Miller so long as I'm the Chair of here I'm going to do everything in my power to be as 8 helpful as possible to Southeast Queens. 9 This is not the beginning nor the end. We've got a lot of work 10 to do when it comes to Sanitation. I just want you 11 12 to know that I'm going to continue to be a partner to try to do right by Southeast Queens on your behalf. 13 14 So, I really appreciate your time here. Thank you. 15 COUNCIL MEMBER MILLER: Thank you. 16 CLERK: By a vote of 4 in the 17 affirmative, 1 in the negative and no abstentions, 18 the item has been adopted by the committee. COUNCIL MEMBER REYNOSO: Thank you and 19 20 the vote is now-the hearing is now closed. Thank you. [gavel] 21 22 23 24 25
