SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: The administrative code of the city of New York is amended by adding new subdivision c this additional data on injuries or illnesses that occur in the course of duty must be recorded by each agency

EFFECTIVE DATE: This legislation shall take effect JANUARY 1, 2005.
