CHAIRPERSON MELINDA R. KATZ: Ring the bell downstairs and we can alert the members, where ever they are in the building, that we are about to start Land Use. It will be a very quick meeting, hopefully, so they should come up right away.

This is Hudson Square North
rezoning L.U. number 818 C070575 ZMM. It is a
rezoning from an M15 to an M15R7X District
amounting to residential in the area of Hudson
Square North. It is in Council Member Quinn's
district. I want to, once again, thank everybody
for their patience. As you know, for any council
member in this body, when they're trying to work
out particulars with the community, the developers
or with the Community Board, we do hold up Land
Use so that they can actually reach accommodations
that they feel are better for the community in
which they represent. There has been an agreement
with Speaker Quinn and so from that agreement, I

will read into the record the accommodations thatwere reached.

From a market rate residential project, there is now going to be 25,000 square feet of commercial use above grade. There will be 5,000 square feet below grade retail use. 20% of the units will be affordable to 80% AMI for the life of the building; it will be permanent affordable. And 25,000 square feet will now be open space. So with the recommendation, any discussion? Council Member Barron.

### COUNCIL MEMBER CHARLES BARRON:

Thank you Madam Chair. I just wanted to encourage my colleagues. Issues like this, particularly when the community is very, very concerned about the changing of zoning in their particular area and what can happen in the future, that there should be more time for the community to be review at least the latest settlement that just happened a few minutes ago. I know they met with community people last night and the community wanted a 41 or 40,000 square feet of open space. The community wanted a larger portion of affordability. The Speaker, I first heard at one moment she was with

the community and against this project and now with the project.

vote no on this project. I know it's very, very difficult to vote against the Speaker. But to vote no in respect to the community and allow them to be more involved n the process and make them respect the community more so they could get more affordability and more square footage of space for open space. And not let this be a developer driven session but let the change come from the bottom up as opposed to the top down. I want encourage you to vote no on this particular item.

CHAIRPERSON KATZ: Council Member

COUNCIL MEMBER TONY AVELLA: I want to echo the comments of my colleague, Council Member Barron. The community has been dead set against this project from the beginning. Although there have been some negotiations, it's more or less telling the community what the deal is rather than real involvement. From my understanding, despite the fact that there is a compromise, the community is still against the project.
