CHAIRPERSON VALLONE: Okay, welcome everybody to this Public Safety Committee Hearing. We do have a quorum. We are joined today by council members Addabbo, Foster, Garodnick, Hiram Monserrate is standing just outside the door that was just shut, and Vincent Gentile just walked in to officially give us the quorum. And we're also joined for the first time by Anthony Como, and we're lucky to have him on this Committee. He's a former prosecutor from Queens, as was I for a summer internship. And we are—

MALE VOICE: [Interposing] Queens.

CHAIRPERSON VALLONE: I know I'm getting there, as was I, from Manhattan. But you will just add to the experience on this Committee, which has, as I was going to say, other former assistant district attorneys and a former police officer, Hiram Monserrate. So I think we are very well situated here to continue to do the good work

we've been doing, and we welcome you aboard and we 2 3 look forward to your input. Today we're voting on 4 Proposed Intro 721-A. I would read the opening only I don't, just to give my colleagues a chance 5 to show up and not be closed out; because the vote 6 will have to be closed when the next hearing 7 8 starts, which will be very soon I'm told. sponsored this bill, along with many other 9 10 colleagues, to ensure than any knucklehead who 11 attempt to jump, climb or suspend themselves from 12 buildings will face appropriate jail time and potential fines. Will this work as a deterrent? 13 Well, you don't have to take my word for it, you 14 15 can ask one of the climbers themselves, who was 16 quoted in the Sun yesterday as saying, yes, this 17 bill would deter other people from doing that. And, you know, as former prosecutors on this 18 19 committee, we all know the difficulty in proving 20 any crime, no less reckless endangerment, when you 21 have to bring in police officers and experts who 22 have to prove beyond a reasonable doubt that the 23 public was endangered, which is very tough to do. And we saw not only how judges threw out these 24 25 type charges, but a grand jury threw out the

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criminal charges in one of these cases. I don't agree with that. I'm sure most of us don't; but it was done. So what we're doing today is making it a definitive, definite crime, which is easy to If you climb, if you jump, if you suspend yourself from a structure of over 50 feet, you are guilty without having to bring the police force and experts and waste taxpayers and prosecutor time and money. We're sending a clear signal that you are not to come here to New York City and endanger our first responders, endanger our pedestrians, so that you can sell a Ginzu knife or protest the weather or something of that nature. So this bill has been amended. So I would like to let you know what the amendments are before you vote on it. We have raised the height of the structure from, I believe, 30 to 50 feet. We have added suspending oneself from these structures to climbing and climbing and jumping. We have exempted specifically recreational structures, doing this with permission from buildings, to clean, scaffoldings, things like that, so that there's no ambiguity. We do now have the support from the police department, which I have a
