2	CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Good morning
3	everyone, I'd like to reconvene the meeting of the
4	Zoning and Franchises Subcommittee. Joining me
5	this morning are members of the Committee, Council
6	Member Simcha Felder, Mike McMahon, Larry
7	Seabrook, Helen Sears and Robert Jackson.
8	Yesterday we had the public hearing on all the
9	items, and today we will have the vote. The item
10	on the Hospital for Special Surgery, although we
11	had the public hearing yesterday, is going to be
12	the vote on that will be laid over until October
13	2nd. So the items we will be voting on are the
14	Mole Sidewalk Café, Papa John's Pizza Sidewalk
15	Café, the 88th Street rezoning and the Waldheim
16	rezoning. Now, the Chair will recommend approval
17	on all items. I just want to make a quick comment
18	about the Waldheim rezoning. I'm a little bit
19	concerned about some of the things that came up at
20	yesterday's hearing, with the way the Community
21	Board's testimony was given. But, regarding one
22	aspect of the rezoning for the Armenian Home
23	Block, but one has to look at, as we've discussed
24	on a number of occasions, one has to look at the
25	totality of the application and it is something

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that the Community has been after for a long, long time. And I know Councilmember Liu does support the application in its present form. And I see we've also been joined by Councilmember Katz. So Chair would recommend approval of all items.

Sure. Councilmember Sears.

HELEN SEARS: My question is, is that we hear from time to time in this Committee when people are distressed about things are particularly not going their way from the community. And then accusations are made. And that happened yesterday at well. I think they're inappropriate at the Committee level, I really do. Now I don't know if that's something we need to look at because when they're accusatorial, it's saying that we need to check into that. And that's not our role to do that. So I think maybe the Committee might want to look at how we address that. I recognize the frustration of those who testified, but at the same time it doesn't place the Committee Members, at least for myself, in being so defiant when we know we're going to vote yes, when they're implying, not implying but saying that something wasn't right, it was

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illegal. And I think we need to take some kind of a policy for the Committee. I don't, know, but I felt like I needed to raise that.

CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Well, I'm glad you did because I thought I had made an attempt to resolve it with the testimony of the Community Board. As it turns out, the testimony of the Community Board I consider to be inappropriate because it's almost like one of our representatives going out to a meeting and stating that they don't appreciate our position on a meeting when they're supposed to be representing So it really was a peculiar situation, but it's something that we have to take a look at. would also mention that as you will recall, I had asked the representative of the 88th Street Rezoning whether or not they would commit to the Community Board's suggestions about lighting and fencing, and they did present me with a letter here and they also gave a copy to Councilmember Katz, that they will fulfill the requirements, requests of the Community Board in terms of that application. So we did receive that information. So with that, seeing no other concerns, comments,

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2	Committee fully. And all things considered, I
3	don't see how I cannot move forward with this
4	rezoning; especially knowing that initially the
5	Committee at the Community Board level basically
6	almost unanimously approved it. I think there may
7	have been one vote against and one abstention.
8	And even though a decision was made at the
9	Community Board level to carve out that one
10	particular area, and subsequently the full
11	rezoning was approved by the Borough President of
12	Queens, Helen Marshall and subsequently by the
13	City Planning Commission. All things considered
14	in totality, I would have to say that I approve
15	the rezoning, based on everything that I know
16	about it, which as you know, I was here until the
17	end of the hearing and heard all of the testimony.
18	So with that, I vote aye on all matters.
19	MALE VOICE: Councilmember Katz?
20	MELINDA R. KATZ: I vote aye.
21	We've gotten contacted by several folks, you know,
22	the Board Members regarding the Waldheim rezoning.

I think it's a good thing. I understand and I was not in the room yesterday, that there was controversy, and I was briefed on that. But I

3	project, the Councilmember approves of it and
4	there's been a lot of community involvement in it
5	over the years. So I vote aye on all.
