Bill de Blasio G. Oliver Koppell Letitia James CHAIRPERSON BREWER: Sergeant, are you ready? Okay. Good morning. I'm Gale Brewer, Chair of the Committee on Technology in the City Council. And, we're here to talk about proposed Resolution Number 1613-A. We had a hearing on this on October 23rd, here in the Committee Room. And, this particular Resolution talks about white spaces, which is the aspect of our planet that will become more available when we go from analog to digital. And, there is a great deal of interest in providing space for other kinds of technology when those channels are then available.

To make a long story short, this
Resolution urges the FCC, which is the Federal
Communications Commission, to talk about ways that
assist the City of New York and people who are
concerned about digital divide. There are three
issues. We have, in New York City, the Broadway
productions, which are really, really important to
all of us. And, the Broadway folks are concerned
that as this space becomes opened up that they
don't get any interference. That's one concern.

Second concern is that the television stations feel that there may be some

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interference as the white spaces also compete with people who are going to be using new devices, this sounds like we're in a new world here, to be able to communicate with each other. These new PDAs are yet to be built or described specifically in our hands, but they will enable us to wirelessly communicate. And, that is a really good thing because the community that is now having to pay a great deal to communicate will be able to do so perhaps at lot less cost. Those devices are being tested. FCC feels that they are able to be used and that they will make sense after quite a few years.

The only thing we're asking in this particular Resolution is that, as we move forward, to give a little bit more time to the FCC to actually promulgate exactly how these devices would work. And, we want a little bit more comment period from the City of New York and from others to be sure that there's no interference, that there is an opportunity to use the devices to erase, or to at least diminish the digital divide and, more importantly, perhaps everybody can agree, make sure that Broadway productions, our
