2	CHAIRPERSON LAPPIN: Good morning.
3	Welcome to the Land Use Sub-Committee on
4	Landmarks, Public Siting and Maritime Uses. I'm
5	Jessica Lappin, the Chair, joined today by members
6	of the Committee, Council member Annabel Palma of
7	the Bronx, Council Member Charles Barron of
8	Brooklyn, Council member Leroy Comrie of Queens,
9	Council member Maria del Carmen Arroyo of the
10	Bronx, Council member John Lui of Queens and
11	Council Member Jimmy Oddo of Staten Island. We're
12	also joined by Council member Simcha Felder, Joel
13	Rivera, Helen Sears and Tony Avella.
14	We have a vote today on one item
15	that is in the Speaker's district. It is a
16	sanitation garage, LU 921, 925 and 926. We had a
17	lengthy hearing on this item. I can't even
18	remember what day; they're all running together.
19	On the 14th and since then the Speaker and her
20	office have been working very diligently with the
21	Sanitation Department to make some modifications
22	to the proposal that will somewhat mitigate the
23	impacts on the community. Although I know that
24	it's not everything that the community wanted and
25	certainly the community had put together an

2	alternative plan that was very helpful in
3	negotiating this item. It is, I think, she has
4	negotiated modifications that do make this into a
5	better proposal.
6	We don't have the final letter
7	outlining these changes that will be entered into
8	the record. We will be receiving it later today
9	from the Department of Sanitation but I did want
10	to mention for the record and for my colleagues
11	who were at the hearing, a number of those changes
12	we had discussion about, the number of employee
13	parking spaces that were being provided in the
14	facility. I think there was a consensus that
15	there were too many. The number of propose
16	parking employee spaces has been reduced from 74
17	to 37, which is a very significant reaction in the
18	number of parking spaces. I think that will, to
19	some extent, impact positively on the traffic
20	congestion.
21	Another issue relating to traffic
22	congestion was the fueling facility there and
23	whether or not other agency vehicles would be
24	allowed to fuel there. The administration has
25	agreed that no other agency vehicles will be

2	permitted to fuel at the proposed garage with the
3	exception of emergency situations.
4	We also had a lot of discussion
5	about the salt shed and the design of the salt
6	shed. I, myself, had mentioned on the record that
7	I thought it would make more sense to have the
8	salt shed be enclosed considering its proximity to
9	the lawn for the tunnel. Sanitation has agreed to
10	completely cover and enclose on all sides the salt
11	shed so that there will be no ventilation openings
12	on the side of the buildings.
13	A couple of other changes I wanted
14	to mention is that there will be granite block
15	pavers that will separate tree pits and that there
16	will be tree shrubs and tree pits that will act as
17	a buffer between the pedestrians on West Street
18	and Spring Street. The city has also committed to
19	having DOT work with state DOT in analyzing the
20	need to locate a pedestrian crosswalk in the area
21	over Route 9A.
22	There had been discussion about
23	future possibility of open space at this site.
24	The green roof that will be built as part of this
25	green building will be built in a way that does

2	not preclude the possibility of joining with a
3	green publicly accessible space that may be
4	proposed as part of the St. John's Center, which
5	is located to the north of this property.
6	And lastly, the city administration
7	and Disney have committed to consider alternative
8	sites that would permit the relocation of the
9	Manhattan Five Garage operation from this combined
10	garage location. If a site is identified and
11	approved during or after the completion of
12	construction of this garage, then the Manhattan
13	Five Garage can be moved to that new location.
14	But that would be determined by discussions
15	between the administration, Community Board Two,
16	the City Council, etc. So there would be a public
17	discussion about that possibility.
18	So with these changes and
19	modifications, and I wanted to thank the
20	Sanitation Department for working with us. I
21	would recommend a favorable vote on the item and
22	ask for the Council to call for a vote.
23	CLERK: Chair Lappin.
24	CHAIRPERSON LAPPIN: Aye.
25	CLERK: Council Member Barron.

2	COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: May I be
3	excused to explain my vote?
4	CHAIRPERSON LAPPIN: Yes.
5	COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: I think
6	those are good improvements. My concern about
7	this project has always been environmental. I
8	think the good thing about it is the Speaker is
9	willing to put something in her district that she
10	probably is not crazy about herself because
11	there's always environmental concerns. That is a
12	plus.
13	Certainly Black and Latino
14	communities have an over abundance of these kinds
15	of projects but having said that, there's still
16	some serious, I think, environmental concerns with
17	the increasing of the trucks that will be
18	utilized. Even though they are going to go to
19	more environmental friendly trucks and they're
20	going to try to do those kind of things. So
21	there's concern about that. I think the community
22	did have some parts of their plans that I think
23	needs further inclusion, some of the things that
24	they're talking about and further discussion
25	whether it's three districts, two districts.

2	For that reason, I'm going to vote
3	no but for the purposes of us extending some more
4	conversation and talk with the community to make
5	it even a more environmentally friendly project.
б	But my no vote is not without understanding that
7	this was a tough decision, I'm certain, for all
8	involved. When you want to really do something
9	about utilizing greater sanitation services but at
10	the same time and in the area where there is poor
11	air quality and there is some traffic congestion
12	concerns. It has been reduced by the number of
13	parking spaces going down to 34 from 70-something.
14	Those are good things. But I just wanted to vote
15	no for the purposes of extending discussion and
16	improving things even more.
17	CLERK: Council Member Comrie.
18	COUNCIL MEMBER COMRIE: We're
19	calling the roll for the vote?
20	CHAIRPERSON LAPPIN: Yes.
21	COUNCIL MEMBER COMRIE: Aye.
22	CLERK: Council Member Lui.
23	COUNCIL MEMBER LUI: Yes.
24	CLERK: Council Member Palma.
25	COUNCIL MEMBER PALMA: Yes.

8	disappoints me greatly to be on the other side of
9	Council Member Barron, I will vote yes.
10	CLERK: By a vote of seven in the
11	affirmative, one in the negative, no abstentions,
12	the item is approved and referred to the full Land
13	Use Committee.
14	CHAIRPERSON LAPPIN: So I'm going
15	to adjourn the meeting and hold the vote open only
16	until the beginning of the Land Use Committee.
