COUNCIL MEMBER JACKSON: Thank you, Mr. Chair. Even though I'm not a member of this committee, the bill that is being reconsidered for override, Intro 837, which is commonly known as the residency bill, is a bill in which I'm the primary sponsor, along with many of our colleagues. Clearly, this is an issue that has been outstanding for such a long time. In fact, the leaders of DC37 and the Speaker and members of the City Council have reached agreement on this. As you indicated in your opening statement, it was voted on by the City Council and is now being considered for an override. I strongly suggest to all of my colleagues that when you reach a consensus with one of the largest unions in this great city of ours, they expect us to continue with our commitment to move forward on this agreement. As a lead sponsor of this, I ask all of the committee members to vote in favor of this particular bill, which is called the residency

They can live outside of New York City and then commute to work in New York City. I ask all of my
