Additionally this legislation would extend the other charter mandated dates relating to Executive Budget actions taken by other officials such as the Independent Budget Office

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and the Borough Presidents. This legislation however does not change the target budget adoption date, the date for the Mayor's submission of a revenue estimate, or the date for fixing the tax rates which are all set at June 5th. So June 5th is our goal.

Secondly the Council will be voting on two resolutions relating to the City Council's Annual Operating Budget. Under the City Charter the Council has until March 10th to submit to the Mayor its own Operating Budget for the next Fiscal Year. This date was extended to April 2nd by legislation passed by this Committee on January 6th.

Today's vote on the operating

Budget will be the Council's first Fiscal 2010

budget action. This year the Council's budget

totals \$50,535,741. Last year the Council cut a

historic 4.3% from its own budget and this year

the Council's reducing its budget again by over

\$1.7 million or 3.3%.

\$751,000 in reductions will come from the Council's Personal Services budget and additional reductions of more than \$970,000 will

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come from the Council's Other than Personal
Services budget. The Council's budget reductions
will impact central staff operations. Council
Members' offices and staff will not be affected.
And I know a lot of members are anxious to hear
that.

Since the Fiscal 2009 budget was adopted in June, the Office of Management and Budget has twice asked agency head to submit programs to eliminate the gap, also known as PEGs. In the first round in September, OMB sought PEG submissions equal to 5% of Agency City tax levy budget for Fiscal 2010 with a further 7% sought in December.

In these difficult financial times we cannot credibly look New Yorkers in the eye and explain why programs they care about are getting less money this year if we are not prepared to do the same ourselves and do more with less. So I am proud of the Council's effort to tighten its bet at the same time New Yorkers are being asked to tighten their belts.

Next we have three Land Use items.

In order to keep their annual operating costs low,

16	newly released formerly incarcerated individual
17	with families including people with AIDS.

Evangelium [phonetic] Vita Housing Development

Fund Corporation located in Council Member Helen

Diane Foster's District. The Evangelium HDFC will

maintain the 4 story, 13 bedroom building disposed

by the City and use it to provide shelter for

homeless, single, pregnant women.

Our last piece of legislation

relates to the adopted Fiscal 2009 Executive
Budget. In an effort to make the budget process
more transparent this Committee will vote on a
Preconsidered Resolution approving certain changes
in the designation of organizations receiving
funding in the Fiscal 2009 Expense Budget,
specifically: the Resolution before us today sets
forth new designations and/or changes in the
designation of certain organizations receiving
local, ageing, and youth discretionary funding as
well as new designations and/or changes in the
designation of certain organizations to receive
funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the
Fiscal 2009 Expense Budget.

Council Members should have the list of these new designations and changes which is attached to the Resolution. For clarification purposes it is to be noted that organizations appearing in the Resolution that have not yet completed the prequalification process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services or by the Council are identified in the attached charts with an asterisk.

Additionally as with all

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Transparently Resolutions, Council Members will have to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any of the groups on the attached list. If any Council Member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the organizations listed, he or she might want to disclose their conflict at the time of their vote as well.

Members of Council Finance are available to answer any questions you may have regarding the transparency Resolution. And Noran Camp is available to answer any questions you may have regarding the conflict of interest disclosure form. Joyce Singerman and Ed O'Malley of the Council Administrative Services Division are here to provide greater detail and answer any questions you may have regarding the Resolutions on the Operating Budget. And Tim Mulligan from the Mayor's Office of Management and Budget is also here to answer any questions you may have on the Executive Budget extender.

I'd like to take a minute of personal privilege to mention that Joyce Singerman will be retiring from the City Council after 15

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Weprin and members of the Finance Committee. I'm
Joyce Singerman, Fiscal Officer, Administrative
Services Division of the City Council. We're
before you today with the Council's proposed
Fiscal Year 2010 Operating Budget. In light of
our economic decline, this budget is \$50,535,741,
a decrease of \$1,274,591 from our Fiscal Year 2009
budget, an overall decrease of 3.3%.

Council Member's budgets will remain at \$227,336; \$317,336 for Committee Chairs. I'm sorry, \$277,336. A PS reduction of \$751,123 will be realized out of central staff by assessing current and future vacancies. We have reduced our OTPS budget by \$973,468. Saving will be achieved by continued efficient and aggressive bidding of contracts for printing and supplies.

We will review and look to reduce central staff services for such things as cable service, Blackberries, cell phones, online subscription services, library books, among others. We will also continue to expand modifications in our purchasing practices to attempt to further reduce spending.
